TODAY'S SCRIPTURES

First Lesson - Philippians 1:3-11

I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus. It is right for me to feel this way about all of you, since I have you in my heart; for whether I am in chains or defending and confirming the gospel, all of you share in God's grace with me. God can testify how I long for all of you with the affection of Christ Jesus. And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless until the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ—to the glory and praise of God.

Second Lesson – Luke 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar—when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of Iturea and Traconitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene— during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the desert. He went into all the country around the Jordan, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. As is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the

prophet: "A voice of one calling in the desert, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him. Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill made low. The crooked roads shall become straight, the rough ways smooth. And all mankind will see God's salvation."

Sermon Text - Malachi 3:1-4

"See, I will send my messenger, who will prepare the way before me. Then suddenly the Lord you are seeking will come to his temple; the messenger of the covenant, whom you desire, will come," says the LORD Almighty. But who can endure the day of his coming? Who can stand when he appears? For he will be like a refiner's fire or a launderer's soap. He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver; he will purify the Levites and refine them like gold and silver. Then the LORD will have men who will bring offerings in righteousness, and the offerings of Judah and Jerusalem will be acceptable to the Lord, as in days gone by, as in former years.

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions December 10-15

Mon The Book of Daniel has 12 chapters, and two per day will reacquaint us with this marvel. Ch.1: Daniel was treated royally in Babylon and was granted Kosher-exemption from palace cuisine, for which God blessed him with good health and superior intellect. Ch. 2: A crisis arose when God gave the king a nightmare which dumbfounded his soothsayers—but Daniel revealed that the empires of Babylon, Greece, and Rome would rise and fall—while the Kingdom of God would stand/endure forever. Amen and Hallelujah!

Tues ch. 3: Since Babylon's national religion put God's people between a rock and a hard place, God came to their rescue by pressuring the king to grant <u>federal</u> protection to Jews practicing their religion. **Ch.4**: Was the king converted? Nope. He needed another nightmare—and in this one God targeted the huge problem of his royal ego. God humiliated him for seven years, which was a hard lesson, but it straightened him out.

Wed Ch.5: Years later his son faced the writing on the wall and learned (via Daniel) that egoism was his problem, too. **Ch.6:** Darius appointed Daniel as Prime Minister, but envious subordinates manipulated the king into making himself the supreme idol of his nation. That put Daniel into a bind with the king—who wasn't a convert but was hopeful that Daniel's deity would not desert him. When the LORD God rescued Daniel from the lions' den, Darius "saw the light" of the Israelite religion. That was a good start.

Thurs Ch. 7: Daniel was feeling hassled, so God came to his rescue with the vision of God's Kingdom built on the Ancient of Days holding court in heaven and delegating His Son to stabilize His Kingdom on Earth. **Ch. 8:** This stabilizing wouldn't happen all at once but would go through some ups-and-downs during the course of our world's history. This vision disturbed Daniel so much that he fell ill and stayed at home for a few days before he could return to the office and carry on his administrative duties. We sympathize.

Fri Ch. 9 Daniel was a reader of God's Word, and because his heart hurt for his people, he apologized to God for the Jews causing so much ruckus that God had to chastise them for seventy years (Gabriel explained it). **Ch.10:** God carried Daniel through the spiritual crisis of facing another elite Angel, who laid out God's agenda for the kingdoms of Persia and Greece. Not to worry!

Sat Chs. 11 and 12 More kingdoms will rise and fall before God rings down the curtain with Judgment Day: The multitudes of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, some to shame and everlasting contempt. . . . But you, go your way till the end; for you shall rest, and will arise to your inheritance at the end of the days." Hallelujah!
