

# **TODAY'S SCRIPTURES**

#### First Lesson – Isaiah 6:1-8

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the LORD seated on a throne, high and exalted, and the train of his robe filled the temple. Above him were seraphs, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. And they were calling to one another: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory." At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke. "Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty." Then one of the seraphs flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. With it he touched my mouth and said, "See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for." Then I heard the voice of the LORD saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I. Send me!"

#### Second Lesson – 1 Corinthians 14:12-20

Since you are eager to have spiritual gifts, try to excel in gifts that build up the church. For this reason anyone who speaks in a tongue should pray that he may interpret what he says. For if I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays, but my mind is unfruitful. So what shall I do? I will pray with my spirit, but I will also pray with my mind; I will sing with my spirit, but I will also sing with my mind. If you are praising God with your spirit, how can one who finds himself among those who do not understand say "Amen" to your thanksgiving, since he does not know what you are saying? You may be giving thanks well enough, but the other man is not edified. I thank God that I speak in tongues more than all of you. But in the church I would rather speak five intelligible words to instruct others than ten thousand words in a tongue. Brothers, stop thinking like children. In regard to evil be infants, but in your thinking be adults.

#### Sermon Text – Luke 5:1-11

One day as Jesus was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret, with the people crowding around him and listening to the word of God, he saw at the water's edge two boats, left there by the fishermen, who were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little from shore. Then he sat down and taught the people from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch." Simon answered, "Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything. But because you say so, I will let down the nets." When they had done so, they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break. So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them, and they came and filled both boats so full that they began to sink. When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at Jesus' knees and said, "Go away from me, Lord; I am a sinful man!" For he and all his companions were astonished at the catch of fish they had taken, and so were James and John, the sons of Zebedee, Simon's partners. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Don't be afraid; from now on you will catch men." So they pulled their boats up on shore, left everything and followed him.



# DAILY BIBLE READINGS FOR HOME DEVOTIONS FEBRUARY 11-16

**Mon Mark's Gospel, 1:14-15** In these first words of Jesus as recorded by Mark, He tells us that God aligned the sprockets, eccentrics, and teeth to mesh so that He could apply power, and the dynamics of salvation moved. Since God has taken sinners to His heart, sinners should take God into theirs, come in out of the cold, and discover the warmth of His home and hearth.

**Tues Mark 5:1-20** Jesus opened God's home to a derelict whose soul was so ravaged that he repelled all human intervention, couldn't rest or sleep, and screamed in torment [how close to hell can you get?]. The demons even faked being on God's side (7), but Jesus threw the demons overboard (8-13). While farmers misjudged Jesus as a financial threat (16-17), the man rescued from hell knew better . . . and became a missionary. Praise the Lord!

**Wed Mark 8:27-33** Some guesses about Jesus' identity came close (27-28), but you and I know better, don't we? He is the Son of God as well as the son of humans; He is the specific and special long-promised Anointed Savior. BTW, *Christ* is English for Χριστο*s*, which is Greek for *Anointed* (and in Hebrew it's *Messiah*). Peter waffled when Jesus predicted His suffering, death, and resurrection, so Jesus straightened him out on that (31-33).

**Thurs Mark 9:31-32** The fact that Jesus should get into trouble for being self-sacrificing is a conundrum to those who are afraid to ask for clarification (32). Another hurdle for human brains is Jesus' resurrection from the dead. How could He survive with no heart-beat, being brain-dead and stone cold for many hours? Well, Jesus cleared that hurdle for Himself and for us, too.

**Fri Mark 10:17-27** This young runner thought he had cleared the 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> hurdles without stumbling, but he had avoided the BIG hurdle. Nobody can clear the hurdles of God's Law who doesn't have the heart to unload his sin onto Jesus. He turned away, saddened that he had to choose between God and self. [Stumbling at Jesus is fatal.]

**Sat Mark 13:32-37** We daren't forget the point Jesus was making, and this reminder keeps us attuned to Him. Here's the issue: we can get so involved (even overwhelmed) in our workaday responsibilities (and in our diversions, too) that we forget the reason God lets us live another day – that we are still on Earth to be of service to Him and to our neighbor. And what Jesus said in olden days to His handful of disciples He is still saying to all of us: Be on the alert for His return to station Earth. *"Watch therefore, for you do not know when the Master of the house is returning . . . whether in the evening, at midnight, at first light, or at full morning. And what I say to you, I say to all: WATCH!"* Even so, come quickly, Lord Jesus! Amen!
