

TODAY'S SCRIPTURES

First Lesson - Deuteronomy 7:6-8

For you are a people holy to the LORD your God. The LORD your God has chosen you out of all the peoples on the face of the earth to be his people, his treasured possession. The LORD did not set his affection on you and choose you because you were more numerous than other peoples, for you were the fewest of all peoples. But it was because the LORD loved you and kept the oath he swore to your forefathers that he brought you out with a mighty hand and redeemed you from the land of slavery, from the power of Pharaoh king of Egypt.

Psalm of the Day - From Psalm 27

- P The LORD is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear?
- C The LORD is the stronghold of my life— of whom shall I be afraid?
- P When evil men advance against me to devour my flesh:
- C When my enemies and my foes attack me, they will stumble and fall.
- P Though an army besiege me, my heart will not fear:
- C Though war break out against me, even then will I be confident.
- P One thing I ask of the LORD, this is what I seek:that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life:
- C To gaze upon the beauty of the LORD and to seek him in his temple.
- P For in the day of trouble he will keep me safe in his dwelling:
- C He will hide me in the shelter of his tabernacle and set me high upon a rock.

Second Lesson - John 10:22-30

Then came the Feast of Dedication at Jerusalem. It was winter, and Jesus was in the temple area walking in Solomon's Colonnade. The Jews gathered around him, saying, "How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Christ, tell us plainly." Jesus answered, "I did tell you, but you do not believe. The miracles I do in my Father's name speak for me, but you do not believe because you are not my sheep. My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one can snatch them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all; no one can snatch them out of my Father's hand. I and the Father are one."

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ, just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love, having predestined us to adoption as sons by Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will, to the praise of the glory of His grace, by which He made us accepted in the Beloved. *Two Special Services Coming in July

On Sunday, July 14, Zachary Ruegge will be confirmed in the faith in the 9:30 am worship service. He recently completed three years of intensive instruction in the main teachings of the Bible as summarized in Martin Luther's *Small Catechism*. During the service on the Sunday before (July 7), there will be a question and answer session on portions of the

catechism. In addition to providing Zachary the opportunity to confess his faith publicly, as Jesus encourages all His disciples to do (Luke 12:8, Romans 10:8-10), it will provide St. Paul parishioners with an opportunity to review the main teachings of God's Word. It will also remind us of the importance of daily renewing our own vows of faithfulness to the Lord and praying for the Spirit's strength to fulfill them to the end (1 Corinthians 1:8-9, 1 Thessalonians 5:23-24).
