TODAY'S SCRIPTURES

First Lesson – 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

13 Brothers, we do not want you to be ignorant about those who fall asleep, or to grieve like the rest of men, who have no hope. 14 We believe that Jesus died and rose again and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him. 15 According to the Lord's own word, we tell you that we who are still alive, who are left till the coming of the Lord, will certainly not precede those who have fallen asleep. 16 For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. 17 After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever. 18 Therefore encourage each other with these words.

Second Lesson – Matthew 22:23-32

23 That same day the Sadducees, who say there is no resurrection, came to him with a question. 24 "Teacher," they said, "Moses told us that if a man dies without having children, his brother must marry the widow and have children for him. 25 Now there were seven brothers among us. The first one married and died, and since he had no children, he left his wife to his brother. 26 The same thing happened to the second and third brother, right on down to the seventh. 27 Finally, the woman died. 28 Now then, at the resurrection, whose wife will she be of the seven, since all of them were married to her?" 29 Jesus replied, "You are in error because you do not know the Scriptures or the power of God. 30 At the resurrection people will neither marry nor be given in marriage; they will be like the angels in heaven. 31 But about the resurrection of the dead—have you not read what God said to you, 32 'I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob'? He is not the God of the dead but of the living."

DAILY BIBLE READINGS FOR HOME DEVOTIONS NOVEMBER 4-9

Mon Ezekiel 36:26-38 The two verses prior to our text are crucial, for God is speaking to those whose hearts had been resurrected from rigor mortis by God's Holy Spirit. Under those conditions God condescended to grant earthly prosperity (28-30). Repentance comes first (31-32); then many blessings may follow (33-36)—not the least of which is the firm conviction that God wasn't a fake but LORD Jehovah, who still loved them. We understand and agree.

Tues Mark 1:21-28 Jesus put first things first by presenting God's Word (21), and they got the message (22). Secondly, a miracle would prove Jesus was more than a premier rabbi, for when He was confronted by a demon who was soiling his human residence, He accepted the challenge. No contest (25-26). And although the demon admitted that Jesus was God's Son, it seems that nobody else caught on. How obtuse of them!

Wed James 5:13-20 We need each other to help cope with arthritis, cancer, the flu, and our hereditary virus of sinfulness. Confession is good for the soul, as are prayers for one another (16). In point of fact, when we focus on a specific (effective) problem and are distressed (fervent) as Elijah was, then God moves heaven and earth to produce a good result (18). Same with us.

Thurs Jeremiah 30:12-17 Jeremiah 30:12-17 Although God had blessed the Hebrews abundantly, they turned from Him to other gods; so God let them pay the price of cheating on Him (12-15). And if His tough love would bring them to repent, God would turn the tables on their adversaries and restore His people to spiritual health. Lord, have mercy on us likewise!

Fri John 9:24-34 Since he enjoyed a unique closeness to Jesus, John was eye-witness to this miracle and ear-witness to the scolding that followed. We marvel at the stupidity of the Pharisees, who saw Jesus as nothing more than a renegade Rabbi. The healed fellow has sharper insight, for which we praise the Holy Spirit. Lord, please enlighten those who sit in spiritual darkness!

Sat Acts 4:13-22 God's Holy Spirit has connected us with Jesus (which is obvious to others, v. 13), but that doesn't make Christians popular. In point of fact, being Christian qualifies us/them for public threats and intimidation (15-18). The Holy Spirit gave Peter and John the splendid response: "Whether it is right in the sight of God to listen to you more than to God, you judge." In other words, "We decline to be intimidated, for we are on God's side in this matter, but you are not! So we (being on God's side) cannot go along with your command that we stop testifying that Jesus has healed this man, for we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard." [Who knows, we may meet some of them in heaven.] Stay tuned.
