

We make no excuses for our sins nor do we minimize their seriousness. We rely only on Your grace and mercy. Declare us innocent on the basis of Christ's innocent suffering and death. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by His authority, I announce unto you the forgiveness of all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

<u>First Lesson</u>: Ephesians 2:1-9 – And you He made alive, who were dead in trespasses and sins, in which you once walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit who now works in the sons of disobedience, among whom also we all once conducted ourselves in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, just as the others. But God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), and raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast.

Second Lesson: John 16:20-22,32,33 – Most assuredly, I say to you that you will weep and lament, but the world will rejoice; and you will be sorrowful, but your sorrow will be turned into joy. A woman, when she is in labor, has sorrow because her hour has come; but as soon as she has given birth to the child, she no longer remembers the anguish, for joy that a human being has been born into the world. Therefore you now have sorrow; but I will see you again and your heart will rejoice, and your joy no one will take from you. Indeed the hour is coming, yes, has now come, that you will be scattered, each to his own, and will leave Me alone. And yet I

am not alone, because the Father is with Me. These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world."

Luther's Explanation to the Third Article of the Apostles' Creed

In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all sins to me and all believers.

On the last day He will raise me and all the dead and give to me and all believers in Christ eternal life.

This is most certainly true.

"Christ Gives Us Our True Identity"

Text: Luke 16:19-31 - "There was a certain rich man who was clothed in purple and fine linen and fared sumptuously every day. But there was a certain beggar named Lazarus, full of sores, who was laid at his gate, desiring to be fed with the crumbs which fell from the rich man's table. Moreover the dogs came and licked his sores. So it was that the beggar died, and was carried by the angels to Abraham's bosom. The rich man also died and was buried. And being in torments in Hades, he lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom. "Then he cried and said, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus that he may dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame.' But Abraham said, "Son, remember that in your lifetime you received your good things, and likewise Lazarus evil things; but now he is comforted and you are tormented. And besides all this, between us and you there is a great gulf fixed, so that those who want to pass from here to you cannot, nor can those from there pass to us.' "Then he said, 'I beg you therefore, father, that you would send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, that he may testify to them, lest they also come to this place of torment.' Abraham said to him, "They have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them.' And he said, "No, father Abraham; but if one goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' But he said to him, "If they do not hear Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded though one rise from the dead."

NOTABLE EVENTS IN THE HISTORY OF ST. PAUL EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH

- January 17, 1993 Founding of St. Paul Congregation (formed from the merging of St. James Lutheran Church, Golden, and St. Luke Lutheran Church, Denver)
- July 7, 1996 Fellowship established with the CLC (doctrinal controversy over the Third Use of the Law resolved by God's grace)
- 1998 1.5 acres of land purchased on Wadsworth Boulevard for the building of a new church
- October 3, 1999 Ground-breaking for new St. Paul church building at 2470
 Wadsworth Blvd, Lakewood (prior to the construction of the church building on Wadsworth services were held in the old St. James church building in Golden)
- February 18, 2001 St. Paul church dedication service
- Monthly services conducted in Colorado Springs: January 2017 December 2018
- Lutheran Service Book adopted as main hymnal for worship services: February 2017
- 20th anniversary service held in commemoration of church dedication: August 29, 2021
