


**Psalm of the Day** From Psalm 37

## +++ Our Lord Speaks to Us in His Word +++

#### First Lesson – Jeremiah 26:1-6

1 Early in the reign of Jehoiakim son of Josiah king of Judah, this word came from the LORD: 2 "This is what the LORD says: Stand in the courtyard of the LORD'S house and speak to all the people of the towns of Judah who come to worship in the house of the LORD. Tell them everything I command you; do not omit a word. 3 Perhaps they will listen and each will turn from his evil way. Then I will relent and not bring on them the disaster I was planning because of the evil they have done. 4 Say to them, 'This is what the LORD says: If you do not listen to me and follow my law, which I have set before you, 5 and if you do not listen to the words of my servants the prophets, whom I have sent to you again and again (though you have not listened), 6 then I will make this house like Shiloh and this city an object of cursing among all the nations of the earth."

P Blessed are they who hear the Word of God and treasure it. Alleluia!



#### Second Lesson – Luke 29:11-27



11 While they were listening to this, he went on to tell them a parable, because he was near Jerusalem and the people thought that the kingdom of God was going to appear at once. 12 He said: "A man of noble birth went to a distant country to have himself appointed king and then to return. 13 So he called ten of his servants and gave them ten minas. 'Put this money to work,' he said, 'until I come back.' 14 But his subjects hated him and sent a delegation after him to say, 'We don't want this man to be our king.' 15 He was made king, however, and returned home. Then he sent for the servants to whom he had given the money, in order to find out what they had gained with it. 16 The first one came and said, 'Sir, your mina has earned ten more.' 17 "Well done, my good servant!' his master replied. 'Because you have been trustworthy in a very small matter, take charge of ten cities.' 18 The second came and said, 'Sir, your mina has earned five more.' 19 His master answered, 'You take charge of five cities.' 20 "Then another servant came and said, 'Sir, here is your mina; I have kept it laid away in a piece of cloth. 21 I was afraid of you, because you are a hard man. You take out what you did not put in and reap what you did not sow.' 22 His master replied, 'I will judge you by your own words, you wicked servant! You knew, did you, that I am a hard man, taking out what I did not put in, and reaping what I did not sow? 23 Why then didn't you put my money on deposit, so that when I came back, I could have collected it with interest?' 24 Then he said to those standing by, 'Take his mina away from him and give it to the one who has ten minas.' 25 'Sir,' they said, 'he already has ten!' 26 He replied, 'I tell you that to everyone who has, more will be given, but as for the one who has nothing, even what he has will be taken away. 27 But those enemies of mine who did not want me to be king over them—bring them here and kill them in front of me."



#### **Our Confession of Faith**

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried; and the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures; and ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of the Father. And He will come again with glory to judge both the living and the dead, whose kingdom will have no end. And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets. And I believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church. I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins, and I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Sermon


Text – 2 Thessalonians 1:1-10

1 Paul, Silas and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: 2 Grace and peace to you from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. 3 We ought always to thank God for you, brothers, and rightly so, because your faith is growing more and more, and the love every one of you has for each other is increasing. 4 Therefore, among God's churches we boast about your perseverance and faith in all the persecutions and trials you are enduring. 5 All this is evidence that God's judgment is right, and as a result you will be counted worthy of the kingdom of God, for which you are suffering. 6 God is just: He will pay back trouble to those who trouble you 7 and give relief to you who are troubled, and to us as well. This will happen when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven in blazing fire with his powerful angels. 8 He will punish those who do not know God and do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. 9 They will be punished with everlasting destruction and shut out from the presence of the Lord and from the majesty of his power 10 on the day he comes to be glorified in his holy people and to be marveled at among all those who have believed. This includes you, because you believed our testimony to you.








Sabaoth (SAH-bay-oath) is Hebrew for "heavenly hosts" Hosanna is a Hebrew word of praise meaning "save us now"



# Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions November 7-12 '22

**Mon Luke 6:20-23** Man looks on the outward appearance, and sees the poor, the hungry, the weeping, the hated. Jesus has a forward look which even now brings great joy. "Blessed are you!" As we approach the end of another year, may it be with the forward look, "for behold, your reward is great in heaven" (v23).

Tues Hebrews 11:32-40 The saints of old did great things and suffered great things, but the distinguishing mark in all of them was their forward-looking faith in Christ, the gift with more promise than anything else in the world.

Wed Revelation 21:1-6 When God came to see our first parents in the Garden of Eden (Gn3), they hid from Him in fear, but in the new heaven and new earth, God's dwelling place is with mankind, and His presence brings joy and every blessing in Christ, the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end (cp22:13).

**Thurs Luke 20:27-38** Jesus was approached by some who thought the promise of resurrection was foolishness, and tried to make it look so with an extended example of a widow remarrying. Jesus points out that the resurrection we look forward to is to a new life, not the same world we left behind. To show that there is a resurrection, He quotes from Moses to show that even after the patriarch believers had died, the Lord at the burning bush called Himself their God.

**Fri Revelation 22:1-5** The angel shows John the new heaven and earth using images which the Scriptures and our present life have made familiar to us: a river, the water of life, bright as crystal, the throne of God, the Lamb, the tree of life, worshipers belonging to God the original source of light (cpGn1:3).

**Sat Isaiah 65:17-25** The prophet looks forward to a world in which the taint of sin and all its effects are no more to be found. This is the kingdom of God and of His Christ, which shall continue to be a joy forever, free from all hurt and destruction, says the Lord! (v 25)
