

Today's Scriptures

First Lesson – Romans 1:1-7

1 Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle and set apart for the gospel of God— 2 the gospel he promised beforehand through his prophets in the Holy Scriptures 3 regarding his Son, who as to his human nature was a descendant of David, 4 and who through the Spirit of holiness was declared with power to be the Son of God by his resurrection from the dead: Jesus Christ our Lord. 5 Through him and for his name's sake, we received grace and apostleship to call people from among all the Gentiles to the obedience that comes from faith. 6 And you also are among those who are called to belong to Jesus Christ. 7 To all in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints: Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ.

Psalm of the Day – From Psalm 24

Second Lesson – Matthew 1:18-25

18 This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. 19 Because Joseph her husband was a righteous man and did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly. 20 But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. 21 She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." 22 All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: 23 "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel"—which means, "God with us." 24 When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. 25 But he had no union with her until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus.

Sermon Text – Isaiah 7:10-14

10 Again the LORD spoke to Ahaz, 11 "Ask the LORD your God for a sign, whether in the deepest depths or in the highest heights." 12 But Ahaz said, "I will not ask; I will not put the LORD to the test." 13 Then Isaiah said, "Hear now, you house of David! Is it not enough to try the patience of men? Will you try the patience of my God also? 14 Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel.

Thanksgiving Memorial Gift Opportunity – "Dear brothers: Our brethren in the CLCI informed the Bd. of Missions of their plans to hold a large memorial service to thank the Lord of the Church for the work and ministry of Pastor VS Benjamin, the founder of the CLCI. They requested financial assistance for outstanding hospital and funeral expenses, as well as for costs associated with a memorial service at which they expect 5,000 attendees. With my approval, the Bd. of Missions has sent funds from Kinship to help with these expenses. As a result, Kinship is in need of replenishment. Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions December 19-24 '22

Mon Psalm 147:12-20 What the fathers most desired... As we near the end of the Psalms and the end of Advent, the Hallelujahs praising God begin to cascade over one another. It is He who protects, blesses, makes peace, fills us with good things, and the list goes on. Best of all, He declares His word to us, which judges us righteous in connection with His Son, Jesus Christ, whose birth we are about to celebrate.

Tues Deuteronomy 18:15-19 What the prophets' heart inspired... Moses is addressing the Children of Israel before he is taken from them. Having warned them about the soothsayers in the countries that lie ahead of them, he points to the true source of Wisdom, the Prophet who is yet to come, who will speak to them the words of life.

Wed Isaiah 12:2-3 The prophet Isaiah looks to the approaching joy when we are saved from God's anger over our sins. The Lord, our strength and song, is totally trustworthy, and His forgiveness means that we may enjoy the water of life!

Thurs Isaiah 12:4-6 The day approaching is a day of joyful songs worshiping and thanking God and proclaiming His glorious deeds in all the earth. Truly He who comes to dwell with us is great in every respect!

Fri John 1:15-18 What they longed for many a year... As great as John the Baptist was, the Savior who came after him was far greater. He was greater than the prophets and apostles, who all received grace upon grace from Him. He was greater even than Moses, who brought God's law which shows our sin, while the Christ delivered us from sin, death, and hell.

Sat 1 John 1:1-4 *Stands fulfilled in glory here (TLH91).* The blessings of God extend from the beginning of the world to all eternity. The Father sent His Son to give us life, to draw us to Himself and to one another. All of His loving-kindnesses in sustaining our present life pale when compared to the joyous eternal fellowship with Him and each other.
