

Today's Scriptures

First Lesson – Exodus 24:12-18

12 The LORD said to Moses, "Come up to me on the mountain and stay here, and I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and commands I have written for their instruction." 13 Then Moses set out with Joshua his aide, and Moses went up on the mountain of God. 14 He said to the elders, "Wait here for us until we come back to you. Aaron and Hur are with you, and anyone involved in a dispute can go to them." 15 When Moses went up on the mountain, the cloud covered it, 16 and the glory of the LORD settled on Mount Sinai. For six days the cloud covered the mountain, and on the seventh day the LORD called to Moses from within the cloud. 17 To the Israelites the glory of the LORD looked like a consuming fire on top of the mountain. 18 Then Moses entered the cloud as he went on up the mountain. And he stayed on the mountain forty days and forty nights.

Psalm of the Day – From Psalm 72

Second Lesson – Matthew 17:1-9

1 After six days Jesus took with him Peter, James and John the brother of James, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. 2 There he was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as the light. 3 Just then there appeared before them Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus. 4 Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here. If you wish, I will put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." 5 While he was still speaking, a bright cloud enveloped them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased. Listen to him!" 6 When the disciples heard this, they fell facedown to the ground, terrified. 7 But Jesus came and touched them. "Get up," he said. "Don't be afraid." 8 When they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus. 9 As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus instructed them, "Don't tell anyone what you have seen, until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

Sermon Text – 2 Peter 1:16-21

16 We did not follow cleverly invented stories when we told you about the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. 17 For he received honor and glory from God the Father when the voice came to him from the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased." 18 We ourselves heard this voice that came from heaven when we were with him on the sacred mountain. 19 And we have the word of the prophets made more certain, and you will do well to pay attention to it, as to a light shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. 20 Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation. 21 For prophecy never had its origin in the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.



Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions (February 20-25 '23)

Mon Mark 10:35-45 Jesus has just told His disciples for the third time that He will be mocked, condemned, crucified, and raised. Their reaction? Forget the suffering. What about special positions in His glory? He patiently teaches them that among them the greatest would serve, just as He, their Master, was serving them!

Tues 1 Corinthians 1:21-25 Paul contrasts God's wisdom with human wisdom, God's power with human power. In both cases, the difference is huge. God's foolishness (the Gospel of forgiveness in Christ) is above the highest human wisdom and God's weakness is above the greatest human strength!

Wed 1 Corinthians 1:26-31 In the Corinthians' own congregation it could be seen that neither human wisdom nor human religiousness had brought them to find salvation in Jesus Christ, but it was God who gave them wisdom, righteousness, sanctification, and redemption in Him (v30).

Thurs Jeremiah 8:4-7 What strange reaction for God's people to have! Even the migratory birds find their way back home again, but God's chosen people fall and do not get up, stray and do not return home. Truly it is only by God's power that humans repent and are returned to God.

Fri Jeremiah 8:8-9 The prophet Jeremiah also sees the contrast of which Paul spoke (1Co1:25), that the wise men are put to shame (v9). The word of the Lord, which the "wise" of this world call foolishness, is wiser than the greatest human wisdom.

Sat John 11:47-57 Another strange reaction. When the chief priests and Pharisees hear how Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead, they decide that Jesus must be killed. He is a threat to their positions. After this meeting the end of any trial He may have is a foregone conclusion. The many coming to the feast hoping to see Jesus are in stark contrast to the leaders who hope to arrest Him.
