



PART 1 INTRODUCTION TO THE CATECHISM THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

The Conclusion to the Commandments

(Read responsively at the conclusion of Part 1)

- P What does God say of all these commandments?
- C He says: "I the LORD your God, am jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing mercy to thousands of those who love Me and keep My commandments."
- P What does this mean?
- C God threatens to punish all who do not obey these commandments. Therefore we should fear His anger and not do anything against what He commands. God also promises grace and every blessing to those who obey these commandments. Therefore, we should love and trust Him and willingly do what He commands.

Luther's Explanation to the Third Article

(Read by all at the conclusion of Part 2)

I believe that I cannot by my own reasoning or effort believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, nor come to Him. But the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified, and kept me in the true faith.

In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith.

In this Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all sins to me and all believers. On the last day He will raise me and all the dead and give to me and all believers in Christ eternal life. This is most certainly true.

- P What is the meaning of this baptism with water?

- C Saint Paul says in the sixth chapter of Romans, "Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life."

What is the Sacrament of the Altar?

(Read responsively at the conclusion of Part 5)

- P What is the Sacrament of the Altar?
- C It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, given to us Christians under the bread and wine to eat and to drink, as it was instituted by Christ Himself.
- P Where is this written?
- C The holy evangelists Matthew, Mark, Luke and the apostle Paul write this way: "Our Lord Jesus Christ, the same night in which He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to His disciples saying, 'Take, eat. This is My body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of Me.' In the same way He took the cup, after supper, gave thanks, and gave it to them saying, 'Drink of it, all of you. This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of Me.'"

PASTORAL CONFERENCE REPORT

On June 18-20, the CLC's General Pastoral Conference met on the campus of ILC in Eau Claire, WI. The assembled pastors enjoyed a time of Christian fellowship and study of God's Word. We were enriched by the Word of God which was proclaimed by our conference chaplain, Pastor Ted Barthels, and by our communion service speaker, Pastor Sam Rodebaugh. The following papers were presented, which are available by request from the pastor:

- New Testament Exegesis: 2 Thessalonians 1:1ff. (Pastor David Ude)
- Is Agreement on Historical Perspective Necessary for God-Pleasing Fellowship? (Pastor Paul Tiefel)
- Report on "In Statu Confessionis" in Light of the Inter-Synod Discussions (Pastor Paul Nolting)
- Review of Theses/Antitheses Re: Fellowship (Pastor John Hein)
- Board of Doctrine Analysis of the Joint Statement

A considerable amount of time was spent discussing the disposition of the proposed "Joint Statement on the Termination of Church Fellowship," which has been adopted by the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS), and the Evangelical Lutheran Synod (ELS). This document was neither adopted nor rejected by our CLC Convention in 2018. We are looking for a final resolution on this matter at next summer's 2020 CLC Convention. The 2019 CLC Pastoral Conference resolved to send a report to our next Convention, which concludes by saying "...we cannot recommend that the Convention adopt the Joint Statement on the Termination of Fellowship." The Conference also gave a report, in response to a request from the 2018 CLC Convention, concerning the status of a CLC Board of Doctrine document entitled "Theses and Antitheses on the Role of Admonition." We are thankful for this time together studying the Word of God and pray that His will might be done in all things, including the matters that have separated us from the WELS and ELS for many years.

The weekend will include Bible Study, Fellowship, Leadership Training, Team and Relationship Building and Worship, as well as many outdoor bonding activities. Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions July 8-13

Mon The Book of Revelation was authored by Jesus and recorded by John, Jesus' close friend. False teachers have man-handled this Word of God, but we needn't back off on their account, so listen up! Chs 2-3: Is my love for Jesus and for sinners cooling off? Am I orthodox some of the time but not all the time? Is my congregation becoming comatose, and only a few are lively? Am I losing my grip on Jesus and the Bible? Am I lukewarm and need spiritual re-kindling? If so, I take my Savior's warnings to heart -- and repent.

Tues What's going on in heaven? *Come up here and I will show you* God's throne room crowded with His retinue, including evangelists, lively creatures, and dignitaries (**ch. 4**). Are they busy? Yes, preoccupied with praising God and worshiping Jesus with (three stanzas of) their ever-new song (**5:9-14**).

Wed 7:9-17 Who are in heaven already? A countless multitude of redeemed souls who have survived the death of their bodies; they have been delivered from the great tribulation of earthly life by the sacrifice of the Son of God; they are enjoying total bliss in the presence of Jesus. See you there!

Thurs Ch. 12&13 This short horror film features God's Old Testament Church as a woman giving birth to the Babe of Bethlehem; the Devil tries to destroy her and her children (the New Testament Church), but is unsuccessful. Satan even generates a duo of beasts who manage to control world economics and religion, to *blaspheme God, His name, and those who dwell in heaven,* and he empowers one of them to seduce souls via miracles and to murder those who don't comply. [Read 2 Thess. 2 for more identifying details.]

Fri Ch. 14:1-13 Due to God's grace and forgiving love, not everybody bows to the beastly duo, for God manages to preserve His children. Note: 144,000 equals 12x12x10x10x10, which equates with perfect holiness tripled. These are the people who have escaped Satan, have died *in the Lord*, and are still helping others by their legacy of testimony and service. God grant that we have the patience of the saints and keep the faith of Jesus!

Sat Ch. 20:4-6 Since a thousand years (10x10x10) adds up to perfection in triplicate, that's God's way of picturing His Kingdom especially in the New Testament era. Note: God's children enjoy two resurrections, for when our body dies, our soul goes to heaven, so that's a first resurrection. Next, when our body gets re-joined with our soul on Judgment Day, we return to heaven, and that's a second resurrection. When the **un**believer dies, however, his/her soul does not go to heaven, but to hell—and that's the first death. Next, when their body and soul get reunited on Judgment Day, they have to return to hell, and that's their second death. This is God's word on it. Amen.
