

Liturgical Notes for the Festival of Pentecost

Pentecost, fifty days after the celebration of our Lord's resurrection, was originally a Jewish feast, known also as the Feast of Weeks. It was a celebration of the grain harvest. Bread made from the new grain was offered in the temple. As the day Christ's promise concerning the coming of the Spirit was fulfilled, it has become in a sense the birthday celebration of the New Testament Church. Early Christians connected the old celebration of the fruits of the earth's harvest with the fruits of the Spirit's blessing. *Red*, the popular color of fire, is the color of the paraments, reminiscent of the tongues of fire by which the Spirit manifested His presence to the disciples.

Today's Scriptures

First Lesson – Joel 2:28-29

28 "And afterward, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your old men will dream dreams, your young men will see visions. 29 Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days.



Psalm for the Day – From Psalm 51

- P O Lord, open my lips:
- C And my mouth will declare your praise.
- P You do not delight in sacrifice, or I would bring it:
- C You do not take pleasure in burnt offerings.
- P The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit:
- C A broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.
- P Create in me a pure heart, O God:
- C And renew a steadfast spirit within me.
- P Do not cast me from your presence:
- C Or take your Holy Spirit from me.
- P Restore to me the joy of your salvation:
- C And grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me.
- P Then I will teach transgressors your ways:
- C And sinners will turn back to you.

Second Lesson – Acts 2:1-21

1 When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. 2 Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. 3 They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. 4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to

speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. 5 Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. 6 When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. 7 Utterly amazed, they asked: "Are not all these men who are speaking Galileans? 8 Then how is it that each of us hears them in his own native language? 9 Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, 10 Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libva near Cyrene; visitors from Rome 11 (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" 12 Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?" 13 Some, however, made fun of them and said, "They have had too much wine." 14 Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: "Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. 15 These men are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning! 16 No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: 17 "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams. 18 Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy. 19 I will show wonders in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and billows of smoke. 20 The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord. 21 And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

Sermon Text – John 16:5-11

5 "Now I am going to him who sent me, yet none of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' 6 Because I have said these things, you are filled with grief. 7 But I tell you the truth: It is for your good that I am going away. Unless I go away, the Counselor will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. 8 When he comes, he will convict the world of guilt in regard to sin and righteousness and judgment: 9 in regard to sin, because men do not believe in me; 10 in regard to righteousness, because I am going to the Father, where you can see me no longer; 11 and in regard to judgment, because the prince of this world now stands condemned.

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions May 29 – June 3, '23

Mon John 14:15-21 As we ponder the gift of the Spirit given on Pentecost, the apostle reminds us that this gift was promised already before Jesus was betrayed, condemned, and crucified for us all. A key word in connection with the promised Spirit of truth is "love" (vv15,21).

Tues Ephesians 2:10-22 With the gift of the Spirit Jesus' disciples would be sent into all the world with the good news of salvation. Here Paul reminds the Ephesians that their good works were planned ahead by God, and that both Jews and Gentiles are brought together before Him by the blood of Christ.

Wed Ezekiel 36:22-28 When God's people strayed from the truth and chased after other gods, the true God's name was profaned among the nations where they were scattered. For the honor of His name He will bring His people back from exile, show them forgiveness, and put His Spirit within them (v28).

Thur John 15:9-16 "Jesus loves me, this I know" from readings like this one. He would have His followers abide in His love (v9). He showed us His love by laying down His life as a sacrifice for us, and we show our love to Him by serving Him in love and sacrificing for one another.

Fri Ephesians 4:11-16 The Lord did not leave us as orphans, but by the Spirit gave apostles, prophets, and other leaders to guide and to equip us for serving Him and one another in this earthly life (v12). With Christ Himself as our head, we speak the truth in love (v15), and the whole body builds itself up in love (v16).

Sat Isaiah 44:1-6 As water is to dry and thirsty ground, so is God's Spirit to His own people, from generation to generation (v3). He brings life and refreshment in every circumstance, persuading us with joy to call ourselves children of the Lord Almighty, besides whom there is no god.]
