

Today's Scriptures

First Lesson – 1 Timothy 2:1-6

1 First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, 2 for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. 3 This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, 4 who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. 5 For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, 6 who gave himself as a ransom for all, which is the testimony given at the proper time.

Psalm of the Day – From Psalm 96

- P Oh sing to the LORD a new song:
- C Tell of his salvation from day to day.
- P Declare his glory among the nations:
- C His marvelous works among all the peoples!
- P Worship the LORD in the splendor of holiness:
- C Tremble before him, all the earth!
- P Let the heavens be glad, and let the earth rejoice:
- C Let the sea roar, and all that fills it.
- P Let the field exult, and everything in it!:
- C Then shall all the trees of the forest sing for joy.
- P For he comes to judge the world in righteousness:
- C And the peoples in his faithfulness.

Second Lesson – Matthew 22:15-21

15 Then the Pharisees went and plotted how to entangle him in his words. 16 And they sent their disciples to him, along with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are true and teach the way of God truthfully, and you do not care about anyone's opinion, for you are not swayed by appearances. 17 Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, or not?" 18 But Jesus, aware of their malice, said, "Why put me to the test, you hypocrites? 19 Show me the coin for the tax." And they brought him

a denarius. 20 And Jesus said to them, "Whose likeness and inscription is this?" 21 They said, "Caesar's." Then he said to them, "Therefore render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's."

Sermon Text – Isaiah 45:1-7

1 Thus says the LORD to his anointed, to Cyrus, whose right hand I have grasped, to subdue nations before him and to loose the belts of kings, to open doors before him that gates may not be closed: 2 "I will go before you and level the exalted places, I will break in pieces the doors of bronze and cut through the bars of iron, 3 I will give you the treasures of darkness and the hoards in secret places, that you may know that it is I, the LORD, the God of Israel, who call you by your name. 4 For the sake of my servant Jacob, and Israel my chosen, I call you by your name, I name you, though you do not know me. 5 I am the LORD, and there is no other, besides me there is no God; I equip you, though you do not know me, 6 that people may know, from the rising of the sun and from the west, that there is none besides me; I am the LORD, and there is no other. 7 I form light and create darkness; I make well-being and create calamity; I am the LORD, who does all these things.

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions November 6-11

Mon Luke 9:57-58 What does it mean to "follow Jesus"? In Luke 9 He has set His face to go to Jerusalem, where He will offer Himself in sacrifice for the sins of the world. Following Jesus will not always mean "smooth sailing" and comfortable accommodations in this life.

Tues Luke 9:59-62 When Jesus calls people to follow Him, they are willing, but various activities, not wrong in themselves, threaten to come between them and the Savior's call. But anything that hinders us from following Him is not to our benefit.

Wed Hebrews 13:1-3 For the Hebrew Christians following Jesus meant showing love to one another, but it didn't stop there. Welcoming strangers (as did Abraham and Lot) also shows the love of Christ, who put Himself in our place to help us when we were helpless.

Thur Hebrews 13:4-6 Following Jesus means showing His love also in the home, honoring marriage, and recognizing threats to our love of Christ, such as the love of money. To fight this threat, we do well to remember our Lord's promise to care for us and be with us always.

Fri Hebrews 13:7-9 As we follow Christ, we remember those who followed Him before us. Since He does not change, neither does the way set out before us change. That which was truly important then, is also truly important now.

Sat Proverbs 24:14-20 Following Christ, who became for us the Wisdom from God (1Cor1:30), means not following or being envious of the wicked, but even loving our enemies, so that we do not celebrate when they stumble (v17).
