Today's Scriptures

First Lesson – Isaiah 52:1-10

The Lord's Coming Salvation

1 Awake, awake, put on your strength, O Zion; put on your beautiful garments, O Jerusalem, the holy city; for there shall no more come into you the uncircumcised and the unclean. 2 Shake yourself from the dust and arise; be seated, O Jerusalem; loose the bonds from your neck, O captive daughter of Zion. 3 For thus says the LORD: "You were sold for nothing, and you shall be redeemed without money." 4 For thus says the Lord GoD: "My people went down at the first into Egypt to sojourn there, and the Assyrian oppressed them for nothing. 5 Now therefore what have I here," declares the LORD, "seeing that my people are taken away for nothing? Their rulers wail," declares the LORD, "and continually all the day my name is despised. 6 Therefore my people shall know my name. Therefore in that day they shall know that it is I who speak; here I am." 7 How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news, who publishes peace, who brings good news of happiness, who publishes salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God reigns." 8 The voice of your watchmen—they lift up their voice; together they sing for joy; for eye to eye they see the return of the LORD to Zion. 9 Break forth together into singing, you waste places of Jerusalem, for the LORD has comforted his people; he has redeemed Jerusalem. 10 The LORD has bared his holy arm before the eyes of all the nations, and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

Come out to meet him.' 7 Then all those virgins rose and trimmed their lamps. 8 And the foolish said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' 9 But the wise answered, saying, 'Since there will not be enough for us and for you, go rather to the dealers and buy for yourselves.' 10 And while they were going to buy, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went in with him to the marriage feast, and the door was shut. 11 Afterward the other virgins came also, saying, 'Lord, lord, open to us.' 12 But he answered, 'Truly, I say to you, I do not know you.' 13 Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour.

Sermon Text – Revelation 19:1-9

Rejoicing in Heaven

1 After this I heard what seemed to be the loud voice of a great multitude in heaven, crying out, "Hallelujah! Salvation and glory and power belong to our God, 2 for his judgments are true and just; for he has judged the great prostitute who corrupted the earth with her immorality, and has avenged on her the blood of his servants." 3 Once more they cried out "Hallelujah! The smoke from her goes up forever and ever." 4 And the twenty-four elders and the four living creatures fell down and worshiped God who was seated on the throne, saying, "Amen. Hallelujah!" 5 And from the throne came a voice saying, "Praise our God, all you his servants, you who fear him, small and great." 6 Then I heard what seemed to be the voice of a great multitude, like the roar of many waters and like the sound of mighty peals of thunder, crying out, "Hallelujah! For the Lord our God the Almighty reigns. 7 Let us rejoice and exult and give him the glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and his Bride has made herself ready; 8 it was granted her to clothe herself with fine linen, bright and pure"— for the fine linen is the righteous deeds of the saints. 9 And the angel said to me, "Write this: Blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb."

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions **November 20-25**

Mon John 10:23-30 Unbelief sometimes pretends that Jesus has not claimed to be the Christ of God. Jesus points to His works in addition to His Word. Both show that it is He who gives eternal life and is one with God the Father.

Tues 1 Thessalonians 5:14-24 As Jesus' works testified that He is the Christ (Jn10:25), so the works that God accomplishes in the sanctified lives of His believers also glorify the Son and the Father who sent Him.

Wed Psalm 39 As we approach the end of another year, we are reminded again of the brief time allotted to us in this life. Those suffering afflictions also face similar thoughts. In this short life, God's enduring goodness remains the source of our solid hope (v7).

Thur John 6:24-29 We have so much more to be thankful for than the food which spoils (v27). We also have Him on whom God has placed His seal of approval and who is worthy of our trust and thanks for all eternity.

Fri 2 Corinthians 9:6-11 The apostle calls upon us to show God's generosity toward us by being generous to others. Because His grace overflowed to us, it will overflow to others through us, resulting in the thanksgiving of many.

Sat Psalm 34:2-9 David invites us to proclaim the greatness of the Lord with him. That greatness consists in His being a Refuge at all times, and letting us taste His sweet deliverance. Thanks be to God!
