




Our Confession of Sins

P I said, I will confess my transgressions unto the Lord.







First Lesson – Isaiah 40:1:1-11

Comfort for God's People

1 Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. 2 Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins. 3 A voice cries: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. 4 Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. 5 And the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken." 6 A voice says, "Cry!" And I said, "What shall I cry?" All flesh is grass, and all its beauty is like the flower of the field. 7 The grass withers, the flower fades when the breath of the LORD blows on it; surely the people are grass. 8 The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever. 9 Go on up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good news; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good news; lift it up, fear not; say to the cities of Judah, "Behold your God!" 10 Behold, the Lord God comes with might, and his arm rules for him; behold, his reward is with him, and his recompense before him. 11 He will tend his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms; he will carry them in his bosom, and gently lead those that are with young.

Second Lesson – Mark 1:1-8

John the Baptist Prepares the Way



1 The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. 2 As it is written in Isaiah the prophet, "Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way, 3 the voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight," 4 John appeared, baptizing in the wilderness and proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. 5 And all the country of Judea and all Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. 6 Now John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist and ate locusts and wild honey. 7 And he preached, saying, "After me comes he who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. 8 I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."



Text – 2 Peter 3:8-14




8 But do not overlook this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. 9 The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance. 10 But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a roar, and the heavenly bodies will be burned up and dissolved, and the earth and the works that are done on it will be exposed. 11 Since all these things are thus to be dissolved, what sort of people ought you to be in lives of holiness and godliness, 12 waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set on fire and dissolved, and the heavenly bodies will melt as they burn! 13 But according to his promise we are waiting for new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells. 14 Therefore, beloved, since you are waiting for these, be diligent to be found by him without spot or blemish, and at peace.



Synod News & Notes

- Please keep our brothers and sisters in Southern India in your prayers. The area has been hit by a typhoon and flooding. This has caused damage to church roofs, members and pastors' houses. Many have had to evacuate and stay in temporary shelters. One of the chairmen who lives near the BELC seminary had to evacuate his house and he and his family are staying in the BELC office.
- Severe flooding has hit the northern part of Tanzania, affecting the TZ-CLC congregation in Mbulu. Although no deaths have been reported, Pastor Jeremiah states that twenty members are in need of food, blankets, and tents for temporary shelter. Pastor Jeremiah has visited the area to evaluate the needs and provide emergency supplies. Thank the Lord for keeping Pastor Solomon, his family, and the Mbulu congregation safe from death and serious injury. Pray for the Lord's blessings on the recovery efforts, and the Lord will continue to provide for and protect the members of His Mbulu flock.

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions December 11-16

Mon Luke 17:20-30 The Pharisees (v20), who assumed they were in the kingdom of God, did not even recognize God's ruler in their midst. His disciples (v22) knew Him and would one day long to see Him come again, which will happen suddenly at just the right time.

Tues 1 Timothy 6:11-16 Unlike the false prophet who thinks godliness is a means to gain material things, the man of God is encouraged to pursue all that reflects the Savior who is coming again.

Wed Malachi 4:1-6 In the closing verses of his book, Malachi contrasts the wicked and the faithful in the day of the Lord's coming. One is trampled by the Lord's power, the other leaping for joy.

Thur Romans 15:4-13 Paul encourages patient endurance and receiving fellow-believers as the God of hope fills us with complete joy, peace, and hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Fri Hebrews 10:35-39 The writer to the Hebrews also encourages Christians to patient endurance, continuing in the faith while waiting for the sure promises of God in Christ.

Sat James 5:7-10 As the prophets of old waited patiently for the end of suffering (v10) and the fulfillment of God's promises, so believers today need patience, also with one another (v9), while waiting for the coming of the Lord.
