

Today's Scriptures

First Lesson – Isaiah 61:1-3,10-11

The Year of the Lord's Favor

1 The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me to bring good news to the poor; he has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound; 2 to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn; 3 to grant to those who mourn in Zion— to give them a beautiful headdress instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the garment of praise instead of a faint spirit; that they may be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the LORD, that he may be glorified. | 10 I will greatly rejoice in the LORD; my soul shall exult in my God, for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation; he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bride adorns herself with her jewels. 11 For as the earth brings forth its sprouts, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to sprout up, so the Lord GOD will cause righteousness and praise to sprout up before all the nations.

Sermon Text – John 1:6-8,19-28

The Testimony of John the Baptist

6 There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. 7 He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. 8 He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light. | 19 And this is the testimony of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" 20 He confessed, and did not deny, but confessed, "I am not the Christ." 21 And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" And he answered, "No." 22 So they said to him, "Who are you? We need to give an answer to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" 23 He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,' as the prophet Isaiah said." 24 (Now they had been sent from the Pharisees.) 25 They asked him, "Then why are you baptizing, if you are neither the Christ, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?" 26 John answered them, "I baptize with water, but among you stands one you do not know, 27 even he who comes after me, the strap of whose sandal I am not worthy to untie." 28 These things took place in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

Synod News & Notes

- ◆ A Replay of the Immanuel Lutheran Christmas Choral Service *The King in the Cradle* from last Friday is online. The strings, flute choir, and band play the first portion. - ◆ New Link for ILC Morning Chapel. Immanuel Lutheran College morning chapel services provide daily edification for the ILC family. It has also served people across the CLC through an email subscription service. Unfortunately, the previous email delivery service is no longer viable. A more reliable service has been set up, but previous users will need to re-subscribe. - ♦ A reminder to keep our brothers and sisters in southern India in your prayers. The area was hit by a typhoon and flooding, which caused damage to church roofs, members and pastors' houses. Many have had to evacuate and stay in temporary shelters. One of the chairmen who lives near the BELC seminary had to evacuate his house and he and his family are staying in the BELC office.
- ◆ Severe flooding has hit the northern part of Tanzania, affecting the TZ-CLC congregation in Mbulu. Although no deaths have been reported, Pastor Jeremiah states that twenty members are in need of food, blankets, and tents for temporary shelter. Pastor Jeremiah has visited the area to evaluate the needs and provide emergency supplies. Thank the Lord for keeping Pastor Solomon, his family, and the Mbulu congregation safe from death and serious injury. Pray for His blessings on the recovery efforts, and that He will continue to provide for and protect the members of His Mbulu flock.
- ◆ 2024 CLC Mission Helper Trip Applications are still being accepted for the 2024 CLC Mission Helper Trip to Africa. Mission Helpers will be privileged to help spread the Gospel to children in either Kenya/Uganda, Tanzania, or Zambia for about three weeks. *The application deadline is January 16*. Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions December 18-23

Mon Isaiah 40:1-2 The Lord has double comfort, double forgiveness, for His people suffering exile in a foreign land. This shows both their great need and His great compassion.

Tues Isaiah 40:3-5 The Lord is going to come to take His exiled people back home. A voice in the wilderness urges all to get rid of anything that might hinder His coming and make a road for Him in the desert.

Wed Isaiah 40:6-8 The comfort which the Lord brings is not based on earthly situations, which change and fade like grass and flowers. No, His comfort is based on the eternal truths of God's Word.

Thur Isaiah 40:9-10 Here is comfort that is worth proclaiming: "Here is your God!" He is stronger than any trouble, even death and hell. That He is "your" God means salvation for you!

Fri Romans 2:12-16 When Jesus comes again to judge, the secrets of people's hearts will be revealed. Then the righteousness which Christ has brought to us will be revealed as our greatest treasure.

Sat Matthew 3:1-12 John calls on all to repent and receive God's forgiveness in Christ. Matthew sees this as the greatest fulfillment of God's promised comfort in Isaiah 40, the paving of the way of the Lord in the wilderness.
