

## **Today's Scriptures**

First Lesson – 1 Corinthians 7:29-31 As Children of God, Live as Strangers Residing in a Temporary World

29 This is what I mean, brothers: the appointed time has grown very short. From now on, let those who have wives live as though they had none, 30 and those who mourn as though they were not mourning, and those who rejoice as though they were not rejoicing, and those who buy as though they had no goods, 31 and those who deal with the world as though they had no dealings with it. For the present form of this world is passing away.

Second Lesson – Mark 1:14-20

Jesus Begins His Ministry and Calls the First Disciples

14 Now after John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee, proclaiming the gospel of God, 15 and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel." 16 Passing alongside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew the brother of Simon casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen. 17 And Jesus said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men." 18 And immediately they left their nets and followed him. 19 And

going on a little farther, he saw James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, who were in their boat mending the nets. 20 And immediately he called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired servants and followed him.

#### Sermon Text - Jonah 3:1-10

Jonah Goes to Nineveh

1 Then the word of the LORD came to Jonah the second time, saying, 2 "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and call out against it the message that I tell you." 3 So Jonah arose and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly great city, three days' journey in breadth. 4 Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's journey. And he called out, "Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" 5 And the people of Nineveh believed God. They called for a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them to the least of them. 6 The word reached the king of Nineveh, and he arose from his throne, removed his robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes. 7 And he issued a proclamation and published through Nineveh, "By the decree of the king and his nobles: Let neither man nor beast, herd nor flock, taste anything. Let them not feed or drink water, 8 but let man and beast be covered with sackcloth, and let them call out mightily to God. Let everyone turn from his evil way and from the violence that is in his hands. 9 Who knows? God may turn and relent and turn from his fierce anger, so that we may not perish." 10 When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil way, God relented of the disaster that he had said he would do to them, and he did not do it.

The CLC World Missions Prayer List for January is now available. Find hard copies may be found on the shelf by the tract rack.



## Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions January 22-27

Mon Matthew 11:25-30 The Son glories in His relationship with the Father, and both Father and Son reveal themselves as gentle, humble, and saving, giving rest to weary souls.

**Tues Romans 5:1-5** The glory of God which is ours in Christ is not diminished even by earthly sufferings, since even these work together for our good, producing patient endurance, tested character and hope.

Wed Numbers 24:10-17 King Balak is willing to pay Balaam to put a curse on the Children of Israel, but God uses Balaam to bless His people instead. "A star will come out of Jacob. A scepter will rise up out of Israel" (v17).

Thurs Acts 3:22-26 Peter preaches in the temple to the crowd gathered around the lame man healed, and points them to the One "in whom all the families of the earth will be blessed" (v25).

Fri Genesis 28:11-17 God reveals His presence to Jacob in a dream, and repeats to him the promise of blessing which will be to all the families of the earth through his offspring, the Savior!

**Sat 2 Peter 1:2-9** Blessings upon blessings are ours in the forgiveness of Christ Jesus our Lord! In fact, if we lack these blessings (moral excellence, knowledge, self-control, etc.), it is because we forget that in Him we have been cleansed from all our sins (v9).
