

Today's Scriptures

First Lesson – Hebrews 3:1-6

1 Therefore, holy brothers, you who share in a heavenly calling, consider Jesus, the apostle and high priest of our confession, 2 who was faithful to him who appointed him, just as Moses also was faithful in all God's house. 3 For Jesus has been counted worthy of more glory than Moses—as much more glory as the builder of a house has more honor than the house itself. 4 (For every house is built by someone, but the builder of all things is God.) 5 Now Moses was faithful in all God's house as a servant, to testify to the things that were to be spoken later, 6 but Christ is faithful over God's house as a son. And we are his house, if indeed we hold fast our confidence and our boasting in our hope.

Second Lesson – Mark 1:21-28 Jesus Heals a Man with an Unclean Spirit

21 And they went into Capernaum, and immediately on the Sabbath he entered the synagogue and was teaching. 22 And they were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one who had authority, and not as the scribes. 23 And immediately there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit. And he cried out, 24 "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are— the Holy One of God." 25 But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" 26 And the unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying out with a loud voice, came out of him. 27 And they were all amazed, so that they questioned among themselves, saying, "What is this? A new teaching with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him." 28 And at once his fame spread everywhere throughout all the surrounding region of Galilee.

Sermon Text – Deuteronomy 18:15-20

A New Prophet like Moses

15 "The LORD your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your brothers—it is to him you shall listen— 16 just as you desired of the LORD your God at Horeb on the day of the assembly, when you said, 'Let me not hear again the voice of the LORD my God or see this great fire any more, lest I die.' 17 And the LORD said to me, 'They are right in what they have spoken. 18 I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their brothers. And I will put my words in his mouth, and he shall speak to them all that I command him. 19 And whoever will not listen to my words that he shall speak in my name, I myself will require it of him. 20 But the prophet who presumes to speak a word in my name that I have not commanded him to speak, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that same prophet shall die.'"

A Warm Welcome to Our Worship Guests!



Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions January 29 - February 3

Mon John 8:12-16 Jesus is the Light of the World, dispelling the darkness that sin brought into it and revealing the loving Father from whom He came.

Tues 1 John 1:5-10 If we claimed to follow Jesus, but continued to walk in darkness, we would be denying that He is light or that God is light. But coming to Him confessing our sins, we find forgiveness and light!

Wed Isaiah 51:1-6 To His believers, who suffer the judgments which the wicked bring down upon a people, God speaks comfort. From the earliest times He has cared for His people, and His salvation will remain forever (v6).

Thurs Isaiah 51:7-12 Again the Lord repeats His comfort to His people. Even the insults and abuse of the wicked will not prevent God from blessing His people. He who saved them from the raging sea monster [Egypt (v9)] and brought them through the Red Sea will surely crown their heads with joy!

Fri John 7:14-17 When the people were amazed at Jesus' teaching, He answered that He was not speaking on His own, but that His teaching came from the One who sent Him. To a follower of God will be revealed the glory of God in His Christ.

Sat Luke 7:1-10 In Jesus' healing of the centurion's servant His creatorglory shines forth. He can preserve the life of the servant without even coming under the same roof or laying eyes on the man!
