Today's Scriptures

First Lesson – Romans 5:1-11

Peace with God Through Faith

1 Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. 2 Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. 3 Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, 4 and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, 5 and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. 6 For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. 7 For one will scarcely die for a righteous person though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die— 8 but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. 9 Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. 10 For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life. 11 More than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

Second Lesson – Mark 8:31-38

Jesus Foretells His Death and Resurrection

31 And he began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes and be killed, and after three days rise again. 32 And he said this plainly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. 33 But turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are not setting your mind on the things of God, but on the things of man." 34 And calling the crowd to him with his disciples, he said to them, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. 35 For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it. 36 For what does it profit a man to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul? 37 For what can a man give in return for his soul? 38 For whoever is ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of Man also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."

Sermon Text – Genesis 28:10-17

Jacob's Dream

10 Jacob left Beersheba and went toward Haran. 11 And he came to a certain place and stayed there that night, because the sun had set. Taking one of the stones of the place, he put it under his head and lay down in that place to sleep. 12 And he dreamed, and behold, there was a ladder set up on the earth, and the top of it reached to heaven. And behold, the angels of God were ascending and descending on it! 13 And behold, the LORD stood above it and said, "I am the LORD, the God of Abraham your father and the God of Isaac. The land on which you lie I will give to you and to your offspring. 14 Your offspring shall be like the dust of the earth, and you shall spread abroad to the west and to the east and to the north and to the south, and in you and your offspring shall all the families of the earth be blessed. 15 Behold, I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land. For I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you." 16 Then Jacob awoke from his sleep and said, "Surely the LORD is in this place, and I did not know it." 17 And he was afraid and said, "How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven.

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions February 26 – March 2

Mon John 8:21-30 Jesus knows the kind of death which lies before Him at their hands (v28-*when you lift up the Son of Man*), but continues to call on the Jews to put their trust in Him for forgiveness.

Tues Hebrews 2:10-15 It was fitting for the Son of God to share in our humanity, that through suffering and dying He might destroy the Devil and free us from our slavery to the fear of death.

Wed Exodus 14:13-21 The Lord saved His people from the hand of their enemies, not with human weapons of war, but with His power over clouds, wind, and waves. So in His own way He will also protect His children today, and bring them to their heavenly home.

Thurs Isaiah 52:7-10 Isaiah pictures the joyous news coming ahead of God's people returning from the Babylonian captivity. How much greater the joy that accompanies God's people going to their heavenly home.

Fri Isaiah 52:11-12 Unlike the release from Egypt, when the Israelites were urged to carry with them the riches of the land, from Babylon they were to take nothing. So also from this world we take no worldly wealth when our journey turns heaven-ward.

Sat Isaiah 52:13-15 The Lord's servant will succeed! Of that we can be assured even when we recoil at His disfigured form. As great as His humiliation will be, His exaltation will be even greater, and "kings will shut their mouths because of him" (v15).

Jacob's Ladder

(Genesis 28:10-18)

As Jacob with travel was weary one day, At night on a stone for a pillow he lay; He saw in a vision a ladder so high That its base was on earth and its top in the sky.
