

name He gives power to become children of God and has promised them His Holy Spirit. He who believes and is baptized will be saved. Grant this, Lord, unto us all.






First Lesson – Ephesians 2:4-10

By Grace Through Faith

4 But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, 5 even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved— 6 and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, 7 so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. 8 For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, 9 not a result of works, so that no one may boast. 10 For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.

P Blessed are they who hear the Word of God and treasure it. Alleluia!





14 And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, 15 that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. 16 "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. 17 For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. 18 Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. 19 And this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil. 20 For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his works should be exposed. 21 But whoever does what is true comes to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that his works have been carried out in God."



Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions March 11-16

Mon John 11:47-52 The Sanhedrin leaders are worried because Jesus is doing many miraculous signs, fearing the loss of their temple and nation. Caiaphas unwittingly prophesies that He is going to die for the people.

Tues John 11:53-57 From that day on the leaders plotted to kill Jesus. It is now only a question of when and how. The order goes out that whoever knows where He is should report to them. But God will cause their evil plans to work for good and bring about our salvation.

Wed Hebrews 10:1-10 The Old Testament animal sacrifices could not take away sins, but fore-shadowed (v1) the coming sacrifice of Christ (v7,9). This would be the one sacrifice for all the people.

Thurs Hebrews 10:11-14 The constant repetition of the animal sacrifices showed that they did not accomplish the atonement for our sins, but the once-for-all-time sacrifice of Jesus indicates that our redemption is complete.

Fri Isaiah 42:1-4 God's chosen and beloved Servant, endowed by the Spirit, will bring good news of gentleness and healing to the nations, even to the gentiles and coastlands.

Sat Isaiah 42:5-8 The Creator of all people on earth will make His righteous Servant both the Fulfiller of the covenant with Israel and a Light to the gentiles (v6). To Him be all praise and glory! (V8)
