

## **Today's Scriptures**

First Lesson – Ephesians 1:16-23

God Made Christ to Be the Head Over All Things for the Good of the Church

16 I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers, 17 that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him, 18 having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, 19 and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe, according to the working of his great might 20 that he worked in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, 21 far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come. 22 And he put all things under his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church, 23 which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

- C He has given us of his Spirit.

44 Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled." 45 Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, 46 and said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, 47 and that repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. 48 You are witnesses of these things. 49 And behold, I am sending the promise of my Father upon you. But stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high." 50 And he led them out as far as Bethany, and lifting up his hands he blessed them. 51 While he blessed them, he parted from them and was carried up into heaven. 52 And they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy, 53 and were continually in the temple blessing God.

#### Sermon Text – Acts 1:1-11

He Will Return the Same Way He Left

1 In the first book, O Theophilus, I have dealt with all that Jesus began to do and teach, 2 until the day when he was taken up, after he had given commands through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. 3 He presented himself alive to them after his suffering by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. 4 And while staying with them he ordered them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, he said, "you heard from me; 5 for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." 6 So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, will you at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?" 7 He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by his own authority. 8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." 9 And when he had said these things, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. 10 And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, 11 and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

## Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions May 6-11

Mon John 14:13-17 Even before His crucifixion, Jesus promises to send another Counselor who will be their strength and stay in the day of opposition. He will bring to mind the words of their Counselor Jesus.

**Tues John 14:18-21** Not only the Spirit of truth and the words of Christ will be given to His disciples, but He Himself will also come to them. Their relationship to Him and to the Father will be one of love!

Wed Revelation 3:14-22 The church of Laodicea was in a wealthy area, not unlike America in the modern world. It was not hard, therefore, for them to forget their unseen spiritual riches in Christ. Earnestly He calls them to repent and enjoy true wealth with Him.

**Thurs Isaiah 54:7-13** The Lord's anger over His people's sin was short-lived compared to the everlasting mercy toward them (v7-9). As great as the Lord's anger over sin is, much greater is the love He lavishes on mankind, bringing greater peace and prosperity than we could ever imagine (v10-13)!

Fri Hebrews 8:1-2 The glory of our great High Priest is shown in His position by the right hand of the throne of heaven. He is our unseen High Priest, for He serves us in heaven's sanctuary, not one built by people.

**Sat 2 Peter 1:2-4** The great and precious promises that God has given us in Jesus are so glorious because they not only speak of grace and peace but also give us the same, by which we escape from the corruption in the world.
