Today's Scriptures

First Lesson – 2 Corinthians 4:5-12

Treasure in Jars of Clay

5 For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. 6 For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. 7 But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us. 8 We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; 9 persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; 10 always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies. 11 For we who live are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh. 12 So death is at work in us, but life in you.

12 "'Observe the Sabbath day, to keep it holy, as the LORD your God commanded you. 13 Six days you shall labor and do all your work, 14 but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you or your son or your daughter or your male servant or your female servant, or your ox or your donkey or any of your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates, that your male servant and your female servant may rest as well as you. 15 You shall remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and the LORD your God brought you out from there with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm. Therefore the LORD your God commanded you to keep the Sabbath day."

Prayer Request (from Missionary Todd Ohlmann): "Please include our brothers and sisters in Christ in Bangladesh in your prayers. Last weekend, Cyclone Demal struck the northeast coast of India and the southern coastal areas of Bangladesh. The Bangladesh Lutheran Church Mission (BLCM) has congregations, preaching stations, and many members in this area. Pastor Banarjee reports that fifteen homes of BLCM members have been destroyed, with an additional twenty-four homes severely damaged. Furthermore, two church buildings have been severely affected. These are some of the only

Christian churches in the area. The cyclone has impacted over fifty BLCM families. These congregations mainly consist of marginalized and impoverished former Hindus who live day to day as subsistence farmers. The cyclone has destroyed this year's crops and future crops, including many established fruit trees. You can view a few pictures **HERE**. The CLC Board of Missions was able to respond quickly by sending immediate Kinship humanitarian aid, praying that the Lord will bless and multiply these funds for the care of the sheep in the BLCM flock. 'The Lord is gracious and full of compassion, Slow to anger and great in mercy. The Lord is good to all, And His tender mercies are over all His works.' (Psalm 145:8–9) Thank you for praying!"

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions June 3-8

Mon Mark 4:26-29 In God's kingdom, as on a farm, people may spread the seed, but they do not make it grow, or even know how it does. It is God who accomplishes the growth in His kingdom, when it comes.

Tues Acts 2:42-47 The love that God's children have for Him and for one another is expressed in their willing (not coerced) care for each other and in their meeting together for the worship and praise of God. The growth is the Lord's work (v47).

Wed Genesis 12:1-4 The Lord calls Abram to continue journeying toward Canaan, and gives "the father of believers" many great and precious promises to spark his faith.

Thurs 1 Timothy 6:6-12 The apostle calls upon young Pastor Timothy to strive for faith and eternal life, rather than for earthly riches which can lead to temptation and many foolish and hurtful desires.

Fri Isaiah 62:6-9 The Lord invites His servants to call upon Him and not to let Him rest until He fulfills His promises to His people. He will "establish Jerusalem" and bless them with fruit to eat and harvest grapes to drink in His courtyards.

Sat Isaiah 62:10-12 The Lord calls His own from every land and people where they may be scattered. Let the pathway be cleared for all God's people to come to Zion. Then she will be called Sought After, A City Not Abandoned.
