

Confession of Sins and Announcement of Forgiveness

- P Dear fellow-redeemed, let us come before our Lord with an open and truthful heart and confess all our sins before God with the confident trust that for the sake of Jesus Christ our Savior, He will grant us forgiveness.
- O most merciful God, who has given Your only begotten Son to suffer and die for us that we might have forgiveness of all our sins, fill us with Your Spirit that we may receive Your gracious mercy with a heart of thanksgiving, a renewed dedication to Your kingdom, and a confident expectation of the fullness of everlasting life.
- P On the basis of this, your heartfelt confession of sins, I, as your called servant of our Lord, announce the gracious forgiving love of God to all of you for the sake of Jesus Christ our Savior and in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

First Lesson – Genesis 3:8-15 Aftermath of the Fall and First Promise of a Savior

8 And they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. 9 But the LORD God called to the man and said to him, "Where are you?" 10 And he said, "I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked, and I hid myself." 11 He said, "Who told you

that you were naked? Have you eaten of the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?" 12 The man said, "The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit of the tree, and I ate." 13 Then the LORD God said to the woman, "What is this that you have done?" The woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate." 14 The LORD God said to the serpent, "Because you have done this, cursed are you above all livestock and above all beasts of the field; on your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life. 15 I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel."

Second Lesson – 2 Corinthians 4:13-18

We fix our eyes not on what we can can see, but on what we cannot see

13 Since we have the same spirit of faith according to what has been written, "I believed, and so I spoke," we also believe, and so we also speak, 14 knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into his presence. 15 For it is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God. 16 So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. 17 For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, 18 as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal.

Confession of Faith

The Apostles Creed

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From there He will come to judge the living and the dead.

All Mankind Fell in Adam's Fall

Sermon Text: Mark 3:20-35

20 Then he went home, and the crowd gathered again, so that they could not even eat. 21 And when his family heard it, they went out to seize him, for they were saying, "He is out of his mind." 22 And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem were saying, "He is possessed by Beelzebul," and "by the prince of demons he casts out the demons." 23 And he called them to him and said to them in parables, "How can Satan cast out Satan? 24 If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. 25 And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. 26 And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but is coming to an end. 27 But no one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his goods, unless he first binds the strong man. Then indeed he may plunder his house. 28 Truly, I say to you, all sins will be forgiven the children of man, and whatever blasphemies they utter, 29 but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit never has forgiveness, but is guilty of an eternal sin"— 30 for they were saying, "He has an unclean spirit." 31 And his mother and his brothers came, and standing outside they sent to him and called him. 32 And a crowd was sitting around him, and they said to him, "Your mother and your brothers are outside, seeking you." 33 And he answered them, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" 34 And looking about at those who sat around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! 35 For whoever does the will of God, he is my brother and sister and mother."

Theme: "Who is Jesus' Real Family?"

1. Not His birth family.2. Not Satan's family.3. His *adopted* family!

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions June 10-15

Mon Matthew 9:9-13 Jesus shows mercy upon Matthew, the tax-collector, and calls him to be one of His followers. And when challenged for consorting with sinners, He replies: I came to call sinners.

Tues Acts 3:1-10 Peter and John did not have the wealth of this world to share with the lame man, but they had the Savior Jesus Christ to share with him, and what a difference that made, both for him and others.

Wed Genesis 15:1-6 Abram had refused to accept a reward from the king of Sodom, but in the Lord he has great reward. Though he and his wife are still childless, his descendants are promised to be like the stars in number. Abram believed the Lord!

Thurs Romans 4:1-8 When discussing whether a person's works make him righteous before God, Paul remembers that it was Abraham's belief in the Lord that was credited as righteousness, not his good works (Gen15:6).

Fri Romans 10:1-11 The apostle earnestly desires that the Israelites may be saved, and knows that it will not happen by their keeping the law, but by the righteousness that comes from believing in Jesus Christ.

Sat Ephesians 2:1-10 It is by God's great love, rich mercy, and abundant grace in Jesus Christ that we have been saved, none of it our own doing. Even the good works He lays before our feet to walk in are His doing (v10)!
