
Our Confession of Sins

power to become children of God and has promised them His Holy Spirit. He who believes and is baptized will be saved. Grant this, Lord, unto us all.





First Lesson – Ephesians 4:25–5:2

Do Not Grieve the Spirit, but Walk in Love

4:25 Therefore, having put away falsehood, let each one of you speak the truth with his neighbor, for we are members one of another. 26 Be angry and do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, 27 and give no opportunity to the devil. 28 Let the thief no longer steal, but rather let him labor, doing honest work with his own hands, so that he may have something to share with anyone in need. 29 Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear. 30 And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. 31 Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. 32 Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you. 5:1 Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children. 2 And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

Second Lesson – John 6:39-51

Rejected by His Own



39 And this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me, but raise it up on the last day. 40 For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who looks on the Son and believes in him should have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day." 41 So the Jews grumbled about him, because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven." 42 They said, "Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How does he now say, 'I have come down from heaven'?" 43 Jesus answered them, "Do not grumble among yourselves. 44 No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him. And I will raise him up on the last day. 45 It is written in the Prophets, 'And they will all be taught by God.' Everyone who has heard and learned from the Father comes to me— 46 not that anyone has seen the Father except he who is from God; he has seen the Father. 47 Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life. 48 I am the bread of life. 49 Your fathers ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died. 50 This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die. 51 I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. And the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."



Florida Storm Report: "Brothers in Christ, The storm Debbie has come and gone. Much water, wind and uprooted trees. Now the work begins. The church building came through the storm unscathed. Members were and are without power. In contacting all our members they are okay but some have suffered some damage to buildings and what have you. We thank our gracious God and Lord for His protection and mercy. In our Lord and Savior, (Pastor Doug Priestap), Grace Lutheran Church, Live Oak, FL"

Missionary Evensen Health Update: "Thank you again for all your prayers. I returned to Spokane week before last. I have an appointment for follow up care this Friday. At the last appointment in Lincoln the nurse practitioner was concerned with my tachycardia (fast heart rate). I had a heart monitor installed before I left but the metal sensor caused me to bleed under the adhesive and she recommended that I remove it to make sure the bleeding stops because I'm on the blood thinner for three months because of the clots, so I removed it after only wearing the monitor for three days instead of the planned two weeks. The data did not show any signs of afib, just a fast heart rate, but she recommended I see a cardiologist. Hopefully I can get referred to one Friday and see them soon ... My knees are still very stiff and my right foot continues to swell and be painful. Hopefully the appointment on Friday will address that. I will try to do some physical therapy here to help speed my recovery. I still am using a walker to keep me steady. My return to Togo is set on hold as I try to get back on my feet. Peter Evensen"

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions August 12-17

Mon Matthew 16:13-20 To recognize that Jesus is "the Christ, the Son of the living God" is a gift from the heavenly Father. This is also the solid foundation of the church and the entrance to the kingdom of heaven.

Tues Acts 17:15-21 As Paul waits in Athens, he observes that the greatest human wisdom reaches only as high as idolatry. Some "wise" ones look on Paul as a bird picking up a seed here and a seed there, but still want to hear what he will come up with.

Wed Acts 17:22-34 When Paul stands before the worldly wise, he approaches them about the ignorance they already confess: "an unknown god." He proclaims the God of the Bible to them, and His Son, whom He raised from the dead.

Thurs 1 Samuel 7:5-12 When the Israelites gather before the Lord to confess their sin, the princes of the Philistines think it a good time to attack. But the Lord thunders and the Philistines are routed. The Lord has helped His people! (V12)

Fri 2 Corinthians 8:1-9 In encouraging the Corinthians' gift, Paul points to the Macedonians as an example. Of their own free will they first gave themselves to the Lord, who has already given Himself for us all (v9).

Sat Luke 5:1-11 Early in his relationship with Jesus, Peter gets a glimpse of how far above him Jesus is (v8). Jesus puts his fear to rest, and the fishermen become followers.
