Today's Scriptures

First Lesson – Proverbs 9:1-6

Walk in the Way of Wisdom

1 Wisdom has built her house; she has hewn her seven pillars. 2 She has slaughtered her beasts; she has mixed her wine; she has also set her table. 3 She has sent out her young women to call from the highest places in the town, 4 "Whoever is simple, let him turn in here!" To him who lacks sense she says, 5 "Come, eat of my bread and drink of the wine I have mixed. 6 Leave your simple ways, and live, and walk in the way of insight."

Psalm of the Day – From Psalm 1

The Way of the Righteous and the Wicked, Contrasted

- P Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked:
- C Nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers;
- P But his delight is in the law of the LORD:
- C And on his law he meditates day and night.
- P He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season:
- C And its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers.
- P The wicked are not so:
- C But are like chaff that the wind drives away.
- P Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment:
- C Nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous.
- P For the LORD knows the way of the righteous:
- C But the way of the wicked will perish.



Second Lesson – John 6:51-58 Whoever Feeds on Me Will Live Forever

51 I am the living bread which came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread that I shall give is My flesh, which I shall give for the life of the world." 52 The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" 53 So Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. 54 Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day. 55 For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. 56 Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him. 57 As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever feeds on me, he also will live because of me. 58 This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like the bread the fathers ate, and died. Whoever feeds on this bread will live forever."

Sermon Text – Ephesians 5:15-20

Be Careful How You Walk

15 Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. 17 Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. 18 And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit, 19 addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, 20 giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions August 19-24

Mon Matthew 13:31-32 From a human point of view, God's rule comes in a small way, in a Word. But when it reaches the heart and the hearts of others, it's power will one day be seen.

Tues Matthew 13:33-35 God's rule works from within, unseen, but it will affect one's entire life, which will also touch the lives of our neighbors. When Jesus spoke these parables, He also fulfilled Psalm 78:2.

Wed Mark 4:26-29 The growth of God's rule is not something that comes by human effort, any more than the farmer can make the seeds grow. This is God's doing, whose works and ways are marvelous to see!

Thurs Acts 19:23-40 A riot breaks out in Ephesus when the idol sales have fallen off, and Demetrius sees it as a result of successful apostolic preaching. The uproar is great but the end of it is peace and protection for the Christians there.

Fri 1 Samuel 16:1-13 Saul has turned away from the Lord's favor, and Samuel has come to anoint one of Jesse's sons as future king. Samuel learns that God's choice for ruler is not based on outward appearance, but on the heart within.

Sat Acts 4:32-37 The early Christians show God's gracious ruling among them, both by their powerful testimony about the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and by their actions, helping and encouraging one another.
