

First Lesson – Hebrews 2:9-11

God's Gracious Plan for Bringing Many Sons to Glory

⁹ But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels, for the suffering of death crowned with glory and honor, that He, by the grace of God, might taste death for everyone. ¹⁰ For it was fitting for Him, for whom are all things and by whom are all things, in bringing many sons to glory, to make the captain of their salvation perfect through sufferings. ¹¹ For both He who sanctifies and those who are being sanctified are all of one, for which reason He is not ashamed to call them brethren.

Second Lesson – Mark 10:1-16 Jesus Teaches About Marriage and Divorce
"Let the Little Children to Me"
```

1 Then He arose from there and came to the region of Judea by the other side of the Jordan. And multitudes gathered to Him again, and as He was accustomed, He taught them again. 2 The Pharisees came and asked Him, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife?" testing Him. 3 And He answered and said to them, "What did Moses command you?" 4 They said, "Moses permitted a man to write a certificate of divorce, and to dismiss her." 5 And Jesus answered and said

to them, "Because of the hardness of your heart he wrote you this precept. 6 But from the beginning of the creation, God "made them male and female.' 7 "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, 8 and the two shall become one flesh'; so then they are no longer two, but one flesh. 9 Therefore what God has joined together, let not man separate." 10 In the house His disciples also asked Him again about the same matter. 11 So He said to them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her. 12 And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery." 13 Then they brought little children to Him, that He might touch them; but the disciples rebuked those who brought them. 14 But when Jesus saw it, He was greatly displeased and said to them, "Let the little children come to Me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of God. 15 Assuredly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will by no means enter it." 16 And He took them up in His arms, laid His hands on them, and blessed them.

Sermon Text – Genesis 2:18-24

God's Institution of Marriage

18 And the LORD God said, "It is not good that man should be alone; I will make him a helper comparable to him." 19 Out of the ground the LORD God formed every beast of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to Adam to see what he would call them. And whatever Adam called each living creature, that was its name. 20 So Adam gave names to all cattle, to the birds of the air, and to every beast of the field. But for Adam there was not found a helper comparable to him. 21 And the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall on Adam, and he slept; and He took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh in its place. 22 Then the rib which the LORD God had taken from man He made into a woman, and He brought her to the man. 23 And Adam said: "This is now bone of my bones And flesh of my flesh; She shall be called Woman, Because she was taken out of Man." 24 Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and they shall become one flesh.

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions October 7-12

Mon Matthew 12:1-8 The Pharisees find fault with Jesus' disciples, and He gives them several examples of people serving God who were fed with the priests' food, and who labor every Sabbath day in the temple.

Tues Matthew 12:9-13 The Pharisees look for a way to accuse Jesus, and He sees an opportunity for God to show mercy on the Sabbath day.

Wed 2 Thessalonians 3:5-12 The apostle instructs the Thessalonians not to be idle as they wait for the coming of Christ, but to work quietly as they are able and not be a burden to others.

Thurs 1 Kings 19:1-9a After the Lord's triumph on Mt. Carmel and the end of the drought, Elijah is running for his life. He is ready to die, but an angel tells him that he still has a journey to make to the mountains where Moses had once met with the Lord in a burning bush.

Fri 1 Kings 19:9b-18 Elijah feels alone and discouraged, but the Lord shows him that the mighty powers against him are nothing compared to the power that created the world by His word. God still has kingdom work for Elijah to do and he is not alone.

Sat Luke 13:10-17 The Lord frees a woman of a spirit afflicting her for eighteen years, and is charged with breaking the Sabbath. He points out the hypocrisy in taking care of ones own animals but objecting to God overcoming Satan for mankind on the Sabbath.
