




Our Confession of Sins





First Lesson – Hebrews 10:11-18

Christ's Death Perfects the Sanctified

11 And every priest stands ministering daily and offering repeatedly the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. 12 But this Man, after He had offered one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down at the right hand of God, 13 from that time waiting till His enemies are made His footstool. 14 For by one offering He has perfected forever those who are being sanctified. 15 But the Holy Spirit also witnesses to us; for after He had said before, 16 "This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, says the LORD: I will put My laws into their hearts, and in their minds I will write them," 17 then He adds, "Their sins and their lawless deeds I will remember no more." 18 Now where there is remission of these, there is no longer an offering for sin.

Second Lesson – Mark 13:1-13



Jesus Foretells Destruction of the Temple Signs of the Close of the Age

1 Then as He went out of the temple, one of His disciples said to Him, "Teacher, see what manner of stones and what buildings are here!" 2 And Jesus answered and said to him, "Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone shall be left upon another, that shall not be thrown down." 3 Now as He sat on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked Him privately, 4 "Tell us, when will these things be? And what will be the sign when all these things will be fulfilled?" 5 And Jesus, answering them, began to say: "Take heed that no one deceives you. 6 For many will come in My name, saying, "I am He,' and will deceive many. 7 But when you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be troubled; for such things must happen, but the end is not yet. 8 For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. And there will be earthquakes in various places, and there will be famines and troubles. These are the beginnings of sorrows. 9 "But watch out for yourselves, for they will deliver you up to councils, and you will be beaten in the synagogues. You will be brought before rulers and kings for My sake, for a testimony to them. 10 And the gospel must first be preached to all the nations. 11 But when they arrest you and deliver you up, do not worry beforehand, or premeditate what you will speak. But whatever is given you in that hour, speak that; for it is not you who speak, but the Holy Spirit. 12 Now brother will betray brother to death, and a father his child; and children will rise up against parents and cause them to be put to death. 13 And you will be hated by all for My name's sake. But he who endures to the end shall be saved.



Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions November 11-16

Mon Matthew 24:1-14 When Jesus' disciples asked when the temple and the world would end, He gave them many signs that the end would come, and told them of salvation (v13), but would have them look to the proclaiming of the Gospel (v14).

Tues 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11 The apostle Paul reminds us not to be distracted from the coming day of the Lord. With His gifts of faith, love, and hope (v8), whether we are awake or asleep may we live together with Him (v10).

Wed Isaiah 63:1-6 Isaiah pictures the Lord's return after victory over His enemies. The foe who shouted in triumph when Christ lay in the tomb will surely at last be routed and trampled by His might.

Thurs Isaiah 63:7-9 Our pleas for help and mercy are based on God's great deeds for us through His Son, our Savior, just as the prophet of old sought help based on God's tender care for His people from the beginning.

Fri Matthew 24:15-28 Jesus speaks of Jerusalem's judgment (in Judea, v16), and warns of being lured by false Christs. When Jesus returns again, we will not need to "go find Him." He will surely be with us.

Sat 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 Lest we think that those who die before the Lord returns are missing out on some blessings, Paul reminds us that they will rise first and together we will meet the Lord (v17).
