

First Lesson – Philippians 2:5-11

Christ's Example of Humility

5 Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, 6 who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, 7 but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. 8 And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross. 9 Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, 10 that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth,

and of those under the earth, 11 and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Second Lesson – Luke 19:28-40

The Triumphal Entry

28 When He had said this, He went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. 29 And it came to pass, when He drew near to Bethphage and Bethany, at the mountain called Olivet, that He sent two of His disciples, 30 saying, "Go into the village opposite you, where as you enter you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever sat. Loose it and bring it here. 31 And if anyone asks you, 'Why are you loosing it?' thus you shall say to him, 'Because the Lord has need of it.'" 32 So those who were sent went their way and found it just as He had said to them. 33 But as they were loosing the colt, the owners of it said to them, "Why are you loosing the colt?" 34 And they said, "The Lord has need of him." 35 Then they brought him to Jesus. And they threw their own clothes on the colt, and they set Jesus on him. 36 And as He went, many spread their clothes on the road. 37 Then, as He was now drawing near the descent of the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to rejoice and praise God with a loud voice for all the mighty works they had seen, 38 saying: "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the LORD!' Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" 39 And some of the Pharisees called to Him from the crowd, "Teacher, rebuke Your disciples." 40 But He answered and said to them, "I tell you that if these should keep silent, the stones would immediately cry out."

The Coming King

9 "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your King is coming to you; He is just and having salvation, lowly and riding on a donkey, a colt, the foal of a donkey. 10 I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the horse from Jerusalem; the battle bow shall be cut off. He shall speak peace to the nations; His dominion shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth."

A number of CLCM members recently suffered the loss of their homes (destroyed by fire) and were forced to escape to nearby villages due to the civil war that is racking their nation.
- Prayers are also requested for our Christian brethren of the Church of the
 Lutheran Confession of India (CLCI) who are facing increased persecution.
 The CLCI president and another CLCI pastor were severely beaten last week
 while on the way to church by six masked men. The motorcycle on which
 they were riding was stolen. Please pray for our CLCI brothers and sisters as
 they are facing more and more persecution for their faith in Christ and their
 faithful efforts to spread His saving Gospel.
- Please pray for peace and protection of the people living in the Democratic Republic of Congo, where we also have a mission field. Missionary Evensen wrote in an email recently: "The fighting in the east border by Rwanda and Burundi is very intense. I just received a message from one of our pastors there reporting gunfire in his neighborhood and asking for prayers, stating that their situation is not good."

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions April 14-19

Mon John 12:1-19 Good and evil forces are at work as Jesus is given a dinner by Lazarus' friends, and Judas complains about wasting ointment on Jesus. Jesus rides a lowly donkey into the city where He will die.

Tues 1 Peter 4:1-6 The apostle urges us to have the same mind as Christ, who suffered to gain our victory, that we may not follow our fleshly desires but rather God's desires, even if it means suffering slander.

Wed Exodus 5:22-6:9 Moses asks the Lord about trouble still coming to the people, and receives the answer: I am the Lord. I have heard their groaning. I have remembered my covenant. I will rescue them!

Maundy Thurs Luke 22:8-23 Jesus delights to eat this Passover lamb with His disciples, and institutes a new "meal," giving His own body and blood together with bread and wine. Behold the Lamb of God!

Good Fri Revelation 5:1-14 The vision asks: "Who is worthy" to open the scroll and look into the counsels of God for the things that will be? Elders and angels say: Worthy is the Lamb who was slain!

Sat Exodus 12:1-14 The Lord prepares to rescue His people from Egypt, at the same time picturing the rescue of mankind from sin. It will be a memorial to the Lamb whose blood saved His people from death.
