



Today's Scriptures

♦ First Lesson − Acts 13:44-52

Blessings and Conflict at Antioch

44 On the next Sabbath almost the whole city came together to hear the word of God.
45 But when the Jews saw the multitudes, they were filled with envy; and contradicting and blaspheming, they opposed the things spoken by Paul. 46 Then Paul and Barnabas grew bold and said, "It was necessary that the word of God should be spoken to you first; but since you reject it, and judge yourselves unworthy of everlasting life, behold, we turn to the Gentiles. 47 For so the Lord has commanded us: "I have set you as a light to the Gentiles, that you should be for salvation to the ends of the earth." 48 Now when the Gentiles heard this, they were glad and glorified the word of the Lord. And as many as had been appointed to eternal life believed. 49 And the word of the Lord was being spread throughout all the region. 50 But the Jews stirred up the devout and prominent women and the chief men of the city, raised up persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and expelled them from their region. 51 But they shook off the dust from their feet against them, and came to Iconium. 52 And the disciples were filled with joy and with the Holy Spirit.

All Things Made New

1 Now I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away. Also there was no more sea. 2 Then I, John, saw the holy city, New Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. 3 And I heard a loud voice from heaven saying, "Behold, the tabernacle of God is with men, and He will dwell with them, and they shall be His people. God Himself will be with them and be their God. 4 And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes; there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying. There shall be no more pain, for the former things have passed away." 5 Then He who sat on the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new." And He said to me, "Write, for these words are true and faithful." 6 And He said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. I will give of the fountain of the water of life freely to him who thirsts."

The New Commandment

31 So, when he had gone out, Jesus said, "Now the Son of Man is glorified, and God is glorified in Him. 32 If God is glorified in Him, God will also glorify Him in Himself, and glorify Him immediately. 33 Little children, I shall be with you a little while longer. You will seek Me; and as I said to the Jews, "Where I am going, you cannot come,' so now I say to you. 34 A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. 35 By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another."

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions May 19-24

Mon John 17:9-19 The night before His death, Jesus prays for His disciples, that they may be protected by the Father's name (v11) from the Evil One (v15), filled with Jesus' joy (v13), set apart by His Word (17).

Tues 1 John 3:1-8 Seeing the love of God fills us with eternal hope. In view of this glorious future, let us not keep on sinning. Sin is lawlessness and from the Devil, but Jesus came to destroy the works of the Devil.

Wed Exodus 17:1-7 After having received quail in the evening and manna in the morning, in a water shortage the people were ready to give up on God. But God did not give up on them!

Thurs Isaiah 49:8-13 The promise held out to the Lord's Servant is to the benefit of the people. It means release to the prisoners, relief from hunger and thirst, shouts of joy as the Lord comforts His people.

Fri John 15:10-17 In His great love our Savior heads to the cross, desiring that His disciples remain in His love and joy. There is no greater love than His, and showing His love to one another they will bear fruit.

Sat John 16:5-15 Facing the cross tomorrow, Jesus already promises to send the Counselor to His disciples (v7). He, the Spirit of truth, will guide them into all truth, glorifying Jesus who sent Him.
