

Today's Scriptures

First Lesson – Romans 12:1-2

Offer Your Body as a Living Sacrifice to God

1 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. 2 And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God.

Psalm of the Day – Psalm 103

Praise the Lord for His Mercies

- P Bless the LORD, O my soul:
- C And all that is within me, bless His holy name!
- P Bless the LORD, O my soul:
- C And forget not all His benefits.
- P Who forgives all your iniquities:

Second Lesson – Matthew 22:34-40

Jesus Teaches About the Great Commandment

34 But when the Pharisees heard that He had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together. 35 Then one of them, a lawyer, asked Him a question, testing Him, and saying, 36 "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the law?" 37 Jesus said to him, "'You shall love the LORD YOUR GOD WITH ALL YOUR HEART, WITH ALL YOUR SOUL, AND WITH ALL YOUR MIND.' 38 This is the first and great commandment. 39 And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' 40 On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets."

Sermon Text – Exodus 20:1-6

The First Commandment

1 And God spoke all these words, saying: 2 "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage. 3 "You shall have no other gods before Me. 4 "You shall not make for yourself a carved image—any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth; 5 you shall not bow down to them nor serve them. For I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children to the third and fourth generations of those who hate Me, 6 but showing mercy to thousands, to those who love Me and keep My commandments.

Call News – Pastor Mark Tiefel of Peace Thru Christ Lutheran Church, Middleton, WI, has resigned his call to Peace Thru Christ Lutheran Church, Middleton, WI, and has stepped down from the pastoral ministry. \Leftrightarrow Mr. Rick Mariner has accepted the call to serve as principal of Immanuel Ev. Lutheran Church, Mankato, MN. \Leftrightarrow Pastoral vacancies currently exist at Mountain View CA, Red Wing MN, Manchester MO, Eau Claire WI, and Middleton WI, \Leftrightarrow Teachings vacancies currently exist at Okabena MN and Fond du Lac WI.

Good News from ILC – This fall, Immanuel Lutheran College is projected to have over 30 students enrolled for first time in nearly 20 years. Of these, 15 are in the pre-theology program (studying to be pastors). 11 are in the teacher-training program. If all current pre-theology students to on to graduate, we would expect the following: 1 new pastor in May 2027 and May 2029. In May 2030 there would be 4 new pastors and 1 Limited Ministry candidate, the following year 5 new pastors, the year after that 2 new pastors, and the year after that 3 new pastors. We pray the Lord of the Church to richly bless the studies of all the students enrolled in the three departments at ILC (high school, college, and seminary).

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions July 7-12

Mon Matthew 5:17-19 Jesus supports the entire Old Testament, whether Law, which He will keep, or Prophets, which He will fulfill completely as our substitute, our promised Savior.

Tues Acts 3:9-26 The people were amazed to see the lame man healed, and Peter is swift to credit Jesus for the healing, as well as forgiveness (v19). In Him is the fulfillment of all the prophets' promises (v24)!

Wed Numbers 23:7-12 Balak hired Balaam, the sorcerer, to try to get the Lord to stop blessing the Israelites. But Balaam cannot manipulate the God of Israel, who is intent on blessing many through Israel.

Thurs Ezekiel 18:20-24 To go against the Lord of life means death. The prophet is clear on that. But the Lord does not desire people's death, but that they would turn back to Him and live!

Fri Matthew 5:20-26 The righteousness that Jesus gives us is greater than that of the Scribes and Pharisees. e.g. Not only will we refrain from murder, but also from hurting or harming by word or deed.

Sat Romans 6:3-11 Our new life comes from being baptized into Jesus' death, so that we might also live with Him. As He died to sin on the cross, so also we consider ourselves dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ.

Gracious Lord, as the United States paused this past week to commemorate its independence, we think of the many blessings of love You have showered on us as a nation. Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions June 30 - July 5

Mon Matthew 5:13 Jesus calls His followers salt. Now, salt has certain abilities, like enhancing flavor. But if it loses it's abilities, it is good for nothing, no matter what it is called. Lord, help us to be what You made us!

Tues Matthew 5:14-16 Jesus, the light of the world (Jn8:12), also calls His followers "light." He does not want us to be dark or hidden, but rather to live among people in such a way as to glorify our God and Father.

Wed Acts 3:1-9 Peter and John have no money to give a lame beggar, but give him health in Jesus' name. The man enters the temple, walking, jumping and praising God. The people see and God is glorified!

Thurs Numbers 21:4-9 The peoples' complaints against God call forth His judgment. When they seek His mercy, their lives are spared through looking at a bronze snake lifted up on a pole (cp Jn3:14).

Fri Job 36:26-33 Elihu answers human complaints against God by pointing to God's goodness and power in gathering up drops of water to provide rain, how His lightning shines to the depths, and His thunder warns.

Sat Job 37:1-13 When we hear the voice of thunder, and see the lightning fill the sky, when we see the clouds swirling, and the rain and snow falling at God's direction, who are we to sit in judgment on Him?

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions June 23-28

(catching up from the past 2 weeks)

Mon Matthew 5:1-12 Blessings are pronounced upon the lowly ones in this life (vv3-6), who also reflect their Savior's mercy, purity, peace, and sufferings (vv7-12)in their daily walk. Theirs is the kingdom of heaven!

Tues Acts 2:42-47 As the early Christians continued to hold firmly to the apostles' teaching, they also showed their Lord's love to one another and were viewed favorable by all the people (v47).

Wed Exodus 34:1-10 Moses ascends Mt. Sinai again with stone tablets. The Lord, compassionate and gracious, promises to do marvelous things for His people, which all the people around them will see.

Thurs Psalm 139:1-6 The Psalmist sings of the wonders of our God. He is All-knowing! He knows where we go, what we do. And even before there is a word on our tongue, He already knows it completely!

Fri Psalm 139:7-12 Our God is present everywhere, so He is able to be with us always, guarding and guiding us by His hand. When things are dark for us, they are never dark for Him, but light as day!

Sat Psalm 139:13-24 Our God has shown His great power in our creation, and His goodness in His precious thoughts toward us! He would never side with the wicked. Lord, lead me always in your way!
