

Today's Scriptures

First Lesson – Jeremiah 23:1-6

The Branch of Righteousness

1 "Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of My pasture!" says the LORD. 2 Therefore thus says the LORD God of Israel against the shepherds who feed My people: "You have scattered My flock, driven them away, and not attended to them. Behold, I will attend to you for the evil of your doings," says the LORD. 3 "But I will gather the remnant of My flock out of all countries where I have driven them, and bring them back to their folds; and they shall be fruitful and increase. 4 I will set up shepherds over them who will feed them; and they shall fear no more, nor be dismayed, nor shall they be lacking," says the LORD. 5 "Behold, the days are coming," says the LORD, "That I will raise to David a Branch of righteousness; a King shall reign and prosper, and execute judgment and righteousness in the earth. 6 In His days Judah will be saved, and Israel will dwell safely; now this is His name by which He will be called: THE LORD OUR RIGHTEOUSNESS. 7 "Therefore, behold, the days are coming," says the LORD, "that they shall no longer say, 'As the LORD lives who brought up the children of Israel from the land of Egypt,' 8 but, "As the LORD lives who brought up and led the descendants of the house of Israel from the north country and from all the countries where I had driven them.' And they shall dwell in their own land."

Psalm of the Day – Psalm 98

- C For He has done marvelous things.
- P The LORD has made known His salvation:
- C His righteousness He has revealed in the sight of the nations.
- P He has remembered His mercy and His faithfulness to the house of Israel:
- C All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God.
- P Shout joyfully to the LORD, all the earth:
- C Break forth in song, rejoice, and sing praises.
- P Sing to the LORD with the harp:
- C With the harp and the sound of a psalm.
- P Shout joyfully before the LORD, the King:

- C For He is coming to judge the earth.
- P With righteousness He shall judge the world:
- C And the peoples with equity.

Second Lesson – Colossians 1:13-20

The Preeminence of Christ Our King

13 He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, 14 in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins. 15 He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. 16 For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers. All things were created through Him and for Him. 17 And He is before all things, and in Him all things consist. 18 And He is the head of the body, the church, who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things He may have the preeminence. 19 For it pleased the Father that in Him all the fullness should dwell, 20 and by Him to reconcile all things to Himself, by Him, whether things on earth or things in heaven, having made peace through the blood of His cross.

Sermon Text – Luke 23:35-43

The King on a Cross

35 And the people stood looking on. But even the rulers with them sneered, saying, "He saved others; let Him save Himself if He is the Christ, the chosen of God." 36 The soldiers also mocked Him, coming and offering Him sour wine, 37 and saying, "If You are the King of the Jews, save Yourself." 38 And an inscription also was written over Him in letters of Greek, Latin, and Hebrew: THIS IS THE KING OF THE JEWS. 39 Then one of the criminals who were hanged blasphemed Him, saying, "If You are the Christ, save Yourself and us." 40 But the other, answering, rebuked him, saying, "Do you not even fear God, seeing you are under the same condemnation? 41 And we indeed justly, for we receive the due reward of our deeds; but this Man has done nothing wrong." 42 Then he said to Jesus, "Lord, remember me when You come into Your kingdom." 43 And Jesus said to him, "Assuredly, I say to you, today you will be with Me in Paradise."

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions November 24-29

Mon Mark 12:18-27 Jesus, heading to the agony of the cross, knows the Scriptures and the power of God, who will raise Him on the third day. The Sadducees, with all their reasoning, are badly mistaken.

Tues Revelation 3:14-22 The church in Laodicea is so comfortable with their material wealth that they are unaware of their spiritual poverty, and their great need for Christ's robe of righteousness.

Wed 2 Chronicles 34:14-28 The reformation in King Josiah's day begins when the priest Hilkiah finds the Book of the Law with it's judgments on those transgressing it. In their trouble they turn to the Lord.

Thurs Luke 12:15-21 *Thanksgiving* – The Father who showers us with material blessings is worthy of our thanks everyday. But Christ makes us "rich toward God," giving blessings even when material things are gone.

Fri Matthew 25:31-46 Looking to the Day of Judgment, we see the sheep and goats divided before any deeds are mentioned. Neither group see their deeds, for the sheep are looking to their Shepherd's deeds.

Sat Revelation 21:1-4 What could be more joyful than God's dwelling place being with people forever and the absence of all those things that plague us in this present world: death, sorrow, crying, and pain?
