First Lesson

Isaiah 7:1-7, 10-14

1 Now it came to pass in the days of Ahaz the son of Jotham, the son of Uzziah, king of Judah, that Rezin king of Syria and Pekah the son of Remaliah, king of Israel, went up to Jerusalem to make war against it, but could not prevail against it. 2 And it was told to the house of David, saying, “Syria’s forces are deployed in Ephraim.” So his heart and the heart of his people were moved as the trees of the woods are moved with the wind. 3 Then the LORD said to Isaiah, “Go out now to meet Ahaz, you and Shear-Jashub your son, at the end of the aqueduct from the upper pool, on the highway to the Fuller’s Field, 4 and say to him: “Take heed, and be quiet; do not fear or be fainthearted for these two stubs of smoking firebrands, for the fierce anger of Rezin and Syria, and the son of Remaliah. 5 Because Syria, Ephraim, and the son of Remaliah have plotted evil against you, saying, 6 “Let us go up against Judah and trouble it, and let us make a gap in its wall for ourselves, and set a king over them, the son of Tabel”— 7 thus says the Lord GOD: “It shall not stand, nor shall it come to pass. | 10 Moreover the LORD spoke again to Ahaz, saying, 11 “Ask a sign for yourself from the LORD your God; ask it either in the depth or in the height above.” 12 But Ahaz said, “I will not ask, nor will I test the LORD!” 13 Then he said, “Hear now, O house of David! Is it a small thing for you to weary men, but will you weary my God also? 14 Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: **Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel.**



Matthew 1:18-25

18 Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows: After His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Spirit. 19 Then Joseph her husband, being a just man, and not wanting to make her a public example, was minded to put her away secretly. 20 But while he thought about these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, “Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take to you Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit. 21 And she will bring forth a Son, and you shall call His name JESUS, for He will save His people from their sins.” 22 So all this was done that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying: 23 **“Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel,” which is translated, “God with us.”** 24 Then Joseph, being aroused from sleep, did as the angel of the Lord commanded him and took to him his wife, 25 and did not know her till she had brought forth her firstborn Son. And he called His name JESUS.



Mon John 1:19-28 John the Baptizer turns aside all renown from himself, that it may go instead to the One far greater “whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie” (v27). To Him must go the praise!

Tues Philippians 4:4-7 Joy in the Lord goes together with gentleness toward others, for our hearts are not guarded by sharp words and weapons, but by the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding (v7).

Wed Luke 2:1-14 On the night before Christmas, we remember how the Christ came quietly to Bethlehem, and was announced to unnamed shepherds at night. But the angels already knew, and rejoiced!

Thurs John 1:16-18 “Grace upon grace” describes our God. And His grace and truth came to us through Jesus Christ. Through the only-begotten Son we learn to know the Father!

Fri Titus 2:11-14 It is the grace of God that brings salvation to all people. This grace also trains us to say “No” to ungodliness, since He gave Himself to redeem us from all lawlessness, and to be His own people.

Sat Isaiah 9:2-7 Joy, light, and freedom are encompassed in the promised child (v6). There will be no end to the peace that He brings, for He will be everything that His names imply!
